b) AUDITOR:

3. Interlocal Cooperative Agreement with Chelan County to allow Skagit County to purchase a ballot tally system using the Request for Proposal let and properly published by Chelan County on June 22, 2015. The Agreement shall commence on the date of execution and end on December 31, 2016.

c) BUDGET AND FINANCE:

4. Funding Agreement with Concrete Chamber of Commerce which awards \$15,000 of Lodging Tax funds to support marketing and advertising for various events as authorized by Resolution No. R20150361. The Agreement commenced on January 1, 2016, and continues until December 31, 2016.
5. Amendment No. 5 to Personal Services Agreement No. C20110438 with Public Financial Management, Inc. to provide financial advisory services and analysis. This Amendment adds language to the end of Section 12 – Defense and Indemnity, and increases compensation by \$40,000 for the extended two-years of service which was executed in A20150197. Total compensation shall not exceed \$140,000. All other terms and conditions of the original Agreement and subsequent Amendments shall remain in effect.
6. Funding Agreement with Children’s Museum of Skagit County which awards \$3,000 of Lodging Tax funds to support marketing and advertising for various events as authorized by Resolution No. R20150361. The Agreement commenced on January 1, 2016, and continues until December 31, 2016.
7. Funding Agreement with Museum of Northwest Art (MoNA) which awards \$1,600 of Lodging Tax funds to support marketing and advertising for various events as authorized by Resolution No. R20150361. The Agreement commenced on January 1, 2016, and continues until December 31, 2016.
8. Funding Agreement with Cascade Days which awards \$6,000 of Lodging Tax funds to support marketing and advertising for various events as authorized by Resolution No. R20150361. The Agreement commenced on January 1, 2016, and continues until December 31, 2016.

d) INFORMATION SERVICES:

9. Resolution to remove computer equipment from Skagit County’s assets which are currently owned and used by Skagit E911.
10. Purchase Reimbursement Agreement PRA16001 with Washington State Administrative Office of the Courts for the partial reimbursement of 12 workstations and 3 laptop devices. The Agreement shall commence on the date of execution and continue until February 12, 2016. Skagit County will be reimbursed up to \$700 for each desktop computer, \$200 for each monitor, and \$1,100 for each laptop computer, or the actual cost, whichever is lower.
11. Amendment No. 2 to Personal Services Agreement No. C20150132 with Code Publishing to codify ordinances as approved by the Skagit County Board of Commissioners for inclusion in the Skagit County Code and to provide web-based internet hosting of the Skagit County Code. This Amendment increases compensation by \$475 for the provision of online red-lined compare versions of Skagit County Code, Title 14. The term remains the same, ending December 31, 2017. All other terms and conditions of the Agreement shall remain in effect.

e) PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT SERVICES:

12. Interlocal Agreement with Skagit Council of Governments to set forth cost allocations associated with the Growth Management Act Steering Committee activities among the parties

to the 2002 Framework Agreement. This Agreement shall commence on the date of execution and end on December 31, 2016, but will automatically extend for 1-year terms. Compensation is expected to not exceed \$10,715.

f) PUBLIC HEALTH:

13. Amendment No. 1 to Funding Agreement No. C20150550 with the Housing Authority of Skagit to provide emergency vouchers and tenant-based rental assistance to farmworkers. Emergency vouchers will provide shelter to approximately thirty (30) to thirty-five (35) individuals and families for a maximum of thirty (30) days. This Amendment authorizes the allocation of additional compensation in the amount of \$16,966. The term remains the same, ending December 31, 2016. Total compensation shall not exceed \$43,319. All other terms and conditions of the original Agreement shall remain in effect.
14. Personal Services Agreement with Community Action of Skagit County to provide services to low-income residents, administration of Veteran's Relief Program, case management services, and support for the East County Resource Center. The Agreement shall commence on the date of execution and continue until December 31, 2016. Skagit County will pay up to \$247,085 for services detailed in the General Services and East County Resource Center, \$147,488 for direct services detailed in the Veterans Relief Program, and \$20,512 for services detailed in the Veterans Case Management Position section. Total compensation for services shall not exceed \$415,085.
15. Amendment No. 5 to Consolidated Contract with the State of Washington Department of Health Contract No. C17124, Skagit County Contract No. C20140646, for the delivery of public health services as described in Exhibit "A", Statement of Work. The purpose of this Amendment is to increase compensation by \$162,445 due to revisions to Exhibit "A", Statements of Work; and updates to Exhibit "B", Allocations and Exhibit "C", Federal Awards. Compensation to Skagit County not to exceed \$940,813. All other terms and conditions of the original Agreement and subsequent Amendments shall remain in effect including the termination date of December 31, 2017.
16. Amendment No. 1 to Professional Service Consultant Agreement No. C20150560 with Paul Schissler Associates, Inc. to provide technical assistance services for the Community Development Block Grant-funded Homeowners Assistance project. This Amendment increases compensation by \$16,250 for the expanded Scope of Work which includes project operation activities involving the Community Development Block Grant-funded Homeownership Assistance project. The term remains the same, ending December 31, 2017. Total compensation shall not exceed \$66,250. All other terms and conditions of the original Agreement shall remain in effect.

g) PUBLIC WORKS:

17. Resolution calling for a public hearing regarding an application for a Franchise Agreement with the Livingston Family, to install, operate, and maintain certain single residence utilities within the Franchise Area. The public hearing is scheduled for February 16, 2016, at 9:30 a.m., or as soon thereafter as possible in the Commissioners Hearing Room.
18. Amendment No. 1 to Personal Services Agreement No. C20150506 with Shannon & Wilson, Inc. to provide engineering services for the Freestad Lake Barrier and Shoreline Restoration Project located on the northeastern side of Samish Island. This Amendment extends the contract from January 31, 2016, to June 30, 2016 in order to complete the design of the Freestad Lake Barrier Lagoon Restoration project, and, modifies employee titles due to reorganization within Shannon & Wilson. Compensation remains the same and shall not exceed \$320,485 which is 50% funded by the Rose Foundation and 50% by the Skagit County Clean Water Fund. All other terms and conditions of the original Agreement shall remain in effect.
19. Resolution awarding bids for the procurement of Maintenance Materials expected to exceed \$25,000 to thirteen identified vendors for the period either beginning or before April 1, 2016, and ending March 31, 2017.

h) RISK MANAGEMENT:

20. Personal Services Agreement with Terri Maki, PhD to provide Job Evaluation Tool services for the Human Resources Department. The Agreement shall commence on the date of execution and shall end on December 31, 2016. Compensation shall not exceed \$10,000 and is based on an hourly rate schedule.
21. Personal Services Agreement with Wells Fargo Insurance Services Northwest, Inc. to provide benefit brokerage services for Skagit County. The Agreement shall commence on the date of execution and end on December 31, 2017. Compensation shall not exceed \$82,000 per year and is based on a rate schedule.

22. Resolution authorizing the ratification of a Personal Services Agreement with Tracy L. Pearson d/b/a Pearson Transcription, LLC to provide legal transcription services. Receipt of an insurance certificate delayed execution of the Agreement by January 1, 2016.
23. Personal Services Agreement with Tracy L. Pearson d/b/a Pearson Transcription, LLC to provide legal transcription services. The Agreement commenced on January 1, 2016, and shall continue until December 31, 2106. Compensation shall not exceed \$15,000 and is based on a rate schedule.

j) PUBLIC HEALTH:

24. Resolution authorizing the ratification of an Interlocal Agreement with the City of Burlington for the provision of staffing and support services at the Senior Center. Receipt and review of contract provisions delayed execution before January 1, 2016.
25. Interlocal Agreement with the City of Burlington for the provision of staffing and support services at the Senior Center. The Agreement commenced on January 1, 2016, and ends on December 31, 2016. Compensation shall not exceed \$25,259, less \$12,180 to offset projected utility costs of the central kitchen, for a sum totaling \$13,079.
26. Resolution authorizing a sole source provider for oven/microwave meal trays provided by Oliver Packaging & Equipment Company for the Senior Nutrition Meal Program.
27. Resolution authorizing the ratification of Vendor Services Agreement with Oliver Packaging & Equipment Company to provide dual oven/microwave meal trays for home-delivered meals. Receipt and review of contract provisions delayed execution before January 1, 2016 and it was important to continue to provide services without interruption.
28. Vendor Services Agreement with Oliver Packaging & Equipment Company to provide dual oven/microwave meal trays for home-delivered meals. The Agreement commenced on January 1, 2016, end ends on December 31, 2016. Compensation shall not exceed \$31,930.60.

k) PUBLIC WORKS:

29. Resolution authorizing the ratification of an Interlocal Cooperative Agreement with Skagit Conservation District to perform work, on a reimbursable basis, to assist Skagit County in the development, implementation and maintenance of water quality programs to meet the goals of Skagit County's Shellfish Protection District. Contract negotiations delayed the finalization of the Agreement for execution before January 1, 2016.
30. Interlocal Cooperative Agreement with Skagit Conservation District to perform work, on a reimbursable basis, to assist Skagit County in the development, implementation and maintenance of water quality programs to meet the goals of Skagit County's Shellfish Protection District. The Agreement commenced on January 1, 2016, and shall continue until December 31, 2016. Compensation shall not exceed \$243,000.
31. Resolution authorizing the ratification of Snohomish County Homeland Security Grant Agreement No. E16-053-Skagit between Skagit County, the Washington State Military Department, and the U.S. Department of Homeland Security for the support of state and local efforts to prevent terrorism and other catastrophic events and to prepare the Nation for threats and hazards that pose the greatest risk to the security of the United States. Due to a

delay in receiving the federal award, Skagit County did not receive the grant documents for consideration until December 31, 2105.

32. Snohomish County Homeland Security Grant Agreement No. E16-053-Skagit between Skagit County, the Washington State Military Department, and the U.S. Department of Homeland Security for the support of state and local efforts to prevent terrorism and other catastrophic events and to prepare the Nation for threats and hazards that pose the greatest risk to the security of the United States. The Agreement commenced on September 1, 2015, and shall continue until June 30, 2017. Compensation to Skagit County shall not exceed \$61,230.
33. Resolution authorizing the ratification of a Personal Services Agreement with Skagit Conservation Education Alliance to perform work, on a reimbursable basis, to assist Skagit County in establishing educational and public involvement programs to inform citizens on the causes on non-point pollution consistent with RCW 90.72.030 and the County's Shellfish Protection District. Contract negotiations delayed the finalization of the Agreement for execution before January 1, 2016.
34. Personal Services Agreement with Skagit Conservation Education Alliance to perform work, on a reimbursable basis, to assist Skagit County in establishing educational and public involvement programs to inform citizens on the causes on non-point pollution consistent with RCW 90.72.030 and the County's Shellfish Protection District. The Agreement commenced on January 1, 2016 ad shall end on December 31, 2016. Compensation shall not exceed \$29,100.

VI. MISCELLANEOUS AGENDA (item 1 through 3):

a) EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES:

1. Interlocal Agreement with Skagit County Fire District No. 15 for the provision of Basic life Support Emergency Medical Services. The Agreement shall commence on the date of execution and continue until December 31, 2018. The County will reimburse the Fire District for all EMS related calls at the rate of \$21 per call, as well for the purchase of up to two (2) mobile data entry devices not to exceed \$4,000.

b) PARKS, RECREATION AND FAIR:

2. Agreement between the Museum of Northwest Art, Burlington-Edison School District and Skagit County regarding the William Cumming 28' mural for public display.

c) PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT SERVICES:

3. Interlocal Cooperative Agreement with the City of Sedro-Woolley to provide for the County's collection of impact fees for building permits. The Agreement shall commence on the date of execution.

The Agreement commenced on September 1, 2015, and shall continue until June 30, 2017. Compensation to Skagit County shall not exceed \$61,230.
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
