IV. CONSENT AGENDA FOR TUESDAY, FEBRUARY 2, 2009 – ITEMS 1 - 21:

a) COMMISSIONERS' OFFICE:

1. Record of the Proceedings for Monday, January 26, 2009.
2. Record of the Proceedings for Tuesday, January 27, 2009.
3. Resolution amending Resolution No. R20080524, which appointed Dorothy J. Anthony to the Upper Skagit Library District Board of Trustees. The amendment changes the ending term date from December 31, 2013, to December 31, 2014.
4. Resolution replacing Climate Action and Sustainability Taskforce member John (Jack) de Yonge who resigned, with Teresa Hansen through the end of 2009.

b) ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES:

5. Personal Services Agreement with Robert Weidner, who serves as the Washington, D.C. government relations advisor to Skagit County and other counties of the Rural Lands County Council. The contract shall commence upon the date of execution and continue through December 31, 2009. Compensation is not to exceed a total of \$7,500.

c) ASSIGNED COUNSEL:

6. Personal Services Agreement with Jason H. Powers, Attorney at Law, to provide legal representation to indigent defendants referred by the Office of Assigned Counsel. These are cases deemed conflict of interest for the Public Defender's Office. The agreement commenced on February 1, 2009, and shall continue through December 31, 2010. Compensation is not to exceed a total of \$75,000.
7. Personal Services Agreement with Ron Costeck, Attorney at Law, to provide legal representation to indigent defendants referred by the Office of Assigned Counsel. These are cases deemed conflict of interest for the Public Defender's Office. The agreement commenced on February 1, 2009, and shall continue through December 31, 2010. Compensation is not to exceed a total of \$75,000.

d) BUDGET & FINANCE:

8. Personal Services Agreement, per Ratification Resolution No. R20090004, with the Skagit County Lodging & Tourism Cooperative for the use of Tourism Tax Funds in the amount of \$25,000 for 2009.

e) CONSERVATION FUTURES:

9. Resolution re-appointing Fred Loffer, Tim Raschko, Aubrey Stargell and Dick Whitmore to the Forest Advisory Board for a three year term, expiring on December 31, 2011.

f) FACILITY MANAGEMENT:

10. Standard Form of Agreement with Dimock Construction LLC for roof repairs at 700 South 2nd Street – Mount Vernon, 2221 Riverside Drive – Mount Vernon, and 250 West Moore Street – Sedro-Woolley, for the low bid amount of \$28,721.89 (plus applicable sales tax).

g) HEALTH DEPARTMENT:

11. Amendment No. 13 to Consolidated Contract No. C20070142 with the Washington State Department of Health, which adds an additional \$448,121 in funding for various public health programs. The amendment brings the total contract amount to \$2,564,555. All other terms and conditions of the original contract shall remain in effect.

h) PARKS & RECREATION:

12. Rafting Contract with Eco Orca Limited, which allows the contractor to launch and exit commercial float trips on the Skagit River from Howard Miller Steelhead Park. The agreement shall commence upon the date of execution and continue through November 30, 2009. A non-refundable permit fee of \$150 shall be paid by the contractor.

i) PROSECUTING ATTORNEY:

13. Quit Claim Deeds and Excise Tax Affidavits from Skagit County to Thomas P. Lacroix and Cathy J. Lacroix to quiet title for a public right-of-way. No monetary value is being exchanged.

j) PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT:

14. Resolution writing off uncollectible and bad debts.

15. Vendor Services Agreement for on-call emergency events with Bobby Wolford Trucking and Demolition, Inc. to provide services related to debris removal, heavy equipment, recycling, sand and gravel, tree removal/trimming and waste hauling. The contract shall be executed upon official declaration of an emergency by the Board of Skagit County Commissioners and continue for one year. Total compensation is not to exceed \$100,000.

16. Vendor Services Agreement for on-call emergency events with Jansma Construction, Inc. to provide services related to culvert pipe, debris removal, erosion control, fencing/rental, heavy equipment, pipeline repair, resurfacing/street repair/construction, sewer/water supply materials, tree removal/trimming and water monitoring. The contract shall be executed upon official declaration of an emergency by the Board of Skagit County Commissioners and continue for one year. Total compensation is not to exceed \$100,000.

17. Vendor Services Agreement for on-call emergency events with Lawn Salon Landscaping Services, LLC to provide services and products related to debris removal. The contract shall be executed upon official declaration of an emergency by the Board of Skagit County Commissioners and continue for one year. Total compensation is not to exceed \$100,000.

18. Vendor Services Agreement with Diesel Services, Inc. to provide mechanical repairs for the Guemes Island Ferry engines as needed on an on-call basis. The agreement shall commence upon the date of execution and continue for one year. Compensation is not to exceed a total of \$9,500.

k) RISK MANAGEMENT:

19. Personal Services Agreement with Evergreen Safety Council, which will provide a qualified instructor and materials necessary for various safety trainings as requested by the Risk Management Department. The agreement commenced on February 1, 2009, and shall continue through December 31, 2009. Compensation is not to exceed a total of \$10,000.

l) SENIOR SERVICES:

20. Amendment No. 2 to Contract No. C20080073 with Northwest Regional Council to provide congregate and home-delivered meals to seniors in Skagit County, which increases the total

compensation by an additional \$19,340. All other terms and conditions of the original contract, including Amendment No. 1, shall remain in effect.

m) SHERIFF'S OFFICE:

21. Resolution authorizing the transfer of obsolete surplus portable radios to the Washington State Patrol Academy.

V. RATIFICATION CONTRACTS AND RESOLUTIONS – ITEMS 22 – 31:

n) HEALTH DEPARTMENT:

22. Resolution ratifying an Interlocal Cooperative Agreement between Skagit County and the National Association of County and City Health Officials, #MRC 091027. The County was awarded a capacity building grant on December 31, 2008; however, a document for execution was not received until January 12, 2009.

23. Interlocal Cooperative Agreement between Skagit County and the National Association of County and City Health Officials, #MRC 091027, which provides \$5,000 in funding for continuation of the Medical Reserve Corp Program. The contract commenced on January 1, 2009, and shall continue through July 31, 2009.

o) HUMAN SERVICES:

24. Resolution ratifying a Personal Services Agreement with Catholic Community Services. Review of the contract terms and scope of work delayed the Personal Services Agreement; however, the Department did not want to delay or deny services to eligible individuals detained at the Juvenile Detention Facility.

25. Personal Services Agreement with Catholic Community Services to provide a Chemical Dependency Professional or Trainee for chemical dependency screening, education, counseling and referral services to juveniles in Skagit County's Juvenile Detention Facility. The agreement commenced on January 1, 2009, and shall continue through December 31, 2009. Total compensation is not to exceed \$42,000.

p) PROSECUTING ATTORNEY:

26. Resolution ratifying a Personal Services Agreement with Joe Mentor and Mentor Law Group to provide services in connection with Water Rights Litigation and Regulation. A signed contract was not received prior to commencement of the agreement.

27. Personal Services Agreement with Joe Mentor and Mentor Law Group to provide legal counsel, representation and services related to the review and/or possible litigation matter described as Water Rights Litigation and Regulation. The agreement commenced on January 1, 2009, and shall continue through December 31, 2009. Compensation is not to exceed a total of \$40,000.

q) SENIOR SERVICES:

28. Resolution ratifying an Interlocal Cooperative Agreement between Skagit County and the Town of Concrete, which was drafted in August 2008; however, review of the agreement provisions delayed it's finalization.

29. Interlocal Cooperative Agreement between Skagit County and the Town of Concrete, which allows Skagit County Senior Services to provide staff, equipment and materials for the delivery of community-based services to senior citizens of Concrete. The agreement

commenced on January 1, 2009, and shall continue through December 31, 2009.
Compensation is not to exceed a total of \$7,639.

r) SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT:

30. Resolution ratifying an Agreement between Skagit County and the Washington Association of Sheriff's and Police Chiefs (WASPC). The agreement was only recently received by WASPC and, therefore, the delay.
31. Agreement between Skagit County and the Washington Association of Sheriff's and Police Chief's (WASPC), which allows for participation in a U. S. Department – Office of Community Oriented Policing Services Methamphetamine Initiative Grant in the amount of \$18,804.30. The agreement commenced on September 1, 2007, and shall continue through August 31, 2009.
