85. Resolution ratifying a Personal Services Agreement with the Western Washington Agricultural Association that allows continuation of support on issues related to water, drainage and fish habitat.
86. Personal Services Agreement with the Western Washington Agricultural Association, which allows for their continuation of support on issues related to drainage, clean water, fish habitat and restoration for the benefit of the County and the agricultural community. The contract commenced on January 1, 2009, and shall expire on December 31, 2009. Compensation is not to exceed a total of \$20,000.
87. Resolution ratifying a Personal Services Agreement with the Skagit Watershed Council to support its work as lead entity for salmon recovery in the Skagit and Samish River watershed.

88. Personal Services Agreement with the Skagit Watershed Council to support its work as lead entity for salmon recovery in the Skagit and Samish River watershed and for support in the County's efforts to educate the public, implement watershed action plan recommendations and to protect and restore riparian habitat in order to improve the functionality and health of the County's watershed. The agreement commenced on January 1, 2009, and shall continue through December 31, 2009. Compensation is not to exceed a total of \$20,000.
89. Resolution ratifying a Personal Services Agreement with the Skagit Conservation Education Alliance to meet requirements of Skagit County Code 6.68 Clean Water (Shellfish Protection) District for 2009.
90. Personal Services Agreement with the Skagit Conservation Education Alliance to assist Skagit County in water quality education. This is necessary to meet the requirements of Skagit County Code 6.68 – Clean Water (Shellfish Protection) District for 2009. The agreement commenced on January 1, 2009, and shall continue through December 31, 2009. Compensation is not to exceed a total of \$8,000.
91. Resolution ratifying an Interlocal Cooperative Agreement with the Skagit County Conservation District, which allows them to perform work in conjunction with the County's Critical Areas Ordinance and Clean Water Program.
92. Interlocal Cooperative Agreement between Skagit County and the Skagit Conservation District, which allows the contractor to perform work, on a reimbursable basis, to assist in completing certain tasks related to the implementation of agricultural and other best management practices consistent with Skagit County's Critical Areas Ordinance and Clean Water Program in 2009. The agreement commenced on January 1, 2009, and shall continue through January 31, 2010. Compensation is not to exceed a total of \$109,000.
