a) COMMISSIONERS:

b) COMMUNITY SERVICES:

3. Resolution calling for a public hearing to consider testimony regarding the application for public service grant component of the Community Development Block Grant. The public hearing is scheduled to take place on Tuesday, April 24, 2012, at 10:30 a.m.

c) FACILITIES:

5. Personal Services Agreement with Parker Corporate Services, Inc. dba Whatcom Security Agency to provide security officer services for the Skagit County Public Safety Building and the Skagit County Courthouse. The Agreement shall commence on April 1, 2012, and continue until December 31, 2014. Compensation shall not exceed \$120,284 per calendar year.

d) HEALTH:

6. Interlocal Cooperative Agreement with Skagit Valley Hospital, Island Hospital, and United General Hospital to provide Rabies Post Exposure Prophylaxis, when deemed necessary. The Agreement shall commence on the date of execution and continue until December 31, 2015. There is no financial consideration associated with this Agreement.

e) HUMAN RESOURCES:

7. Memorandum of Agreement by and between the Board of County Commissioners and the staff attorneys at the Skagit County Public Defender's Office AFSCME Local 176-PD regarding 2012 County closure days.

f) INFORMATION SERVICES:

8. Amendment No. 1 to Interlocal Public Safety Technology Service Agreement No. C20100592 with Skagit 911 to supply Public Safety Services derived from the Spillman Public Safety System. The purpose of this Amendment is to add additional technology capabilities in the Spillman Public Safety System (SPSS) to support local fire agencies and/or emergency responders, and to include additional modules as provided by Spillman Technologies. This Amendment specifies terms and conditions of the CardView service, which is an application written and owned by Skagit County. Skagit County shall invoice Skagit 911 for all allocated costs broken down by Emergency Responder Agencies. All other terms and conditions of the original Agreement shall remain in effect.
9. Resolution authorizing the transfer of surplus computer equipment to the Burlington Edison School District.

g) PARKS, RECREATION AND FAIRGROUNDS:

10. Personal Services Agreement with Skagit Valley Softball Association (SVSA) to provide a venue for the review and resolution of player and umpire grievances, assist with umpire negotiations, and player discipline and to assist with miscellaneous improvements related to the Skagit Valley Playfields, located at 2700 Martin Road in Mount Vernon. The Agreement shall commence on April 2, 2012, and continue until December 31, 2014. Total compensation shall not exceed \$27,000.

h) PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT SERVICES:

11. Interagency Agreement with Washington State Department of Commerce for a Puget Sound Watershed Protection and Restoration Grant to study, consider and, subject to the Board of County Commissioners direction and approval, consider for adoption and implementation an inter-jurisdictional transfer of development rights program in Skagit County. Total budget is for \$271,028, Skagit County will provide \$70,960 in matching funds.

i) PUBLIC DEFENDER:

12. Amendment No. 1 to Client Service Contract No. CSV12020, Skagit County Contract No. C20110310, with the State of Washington Office of Public Defense to provide high quality indigent dependency and termination defense legal services in Skagit County Juvenile Court. The purpose of this Amendment is to amend the Statement of Work-Exhibit B to increase the caseload from an 80 percent FTE caseload (approximately 64 open and active cases) to a 90 percent FTE caseload (approximately 72 open and active cases) and replace James Nelson with Halley Wolcott as attorney to provide legal defense services. All other terms and conditions of the original Agreement shall remain in effect.

j) PUBLIC WORKS:

13. Resolution awarding the bid for one new four-axle dump truck to Valley Freightliner, Incorporated for \$160,706.53.
14. Resolution rejecting the non-responsive bid for As-Needed Electrical Maintenance and Repair Service.
15. Resolution for approval of provisions and specifications and call for bids for maintenance and repair service on Sinclair Island and dock. The bid opening is scheduled to take place on Monday, April 30, 2012, at 2:00 p.m.

Approval of Supplemental Agreement No. 1 to Local Agency Agreement No. C20120053 with Exceltech Consulting, Inc. to provide construction management and inspection services for the Anderson/LaVenture Road Extension Projects Cedardale to Blodgett Skagit County #ES71000-1, Federal Aid #STPUS-7337(005), TIB #9-W-029(002)-1, Blodgett to Blackburn Skagit County #ES71000-1B, Federal Aid #STPUS-7337(004), TIB #9-W-029(002)-1, and South LaVenture Sanitary Sewer System City of Mount Vernon #ES97-72. The purpose of this Supplemental Agreement is to include Exhibit A-1, Supplemental Scope of Services, which authorizes the sub-contracting of professional materials testing and reporting services to Materials Testing and Consulting, Inc. (MTC). This Amendment increases compensation by \$115,807.54 for a new compensation amount not to exceed \$1,268,046.62. All other terms and conditions of the original Agreement shall remain in effect.
17. Local Agency Standard Consultant Agreement with PND Engineers, Inc. to provide marine, bridge, structural civil and geotechnical engineering services for various marine projects. The Agreement shall commence on the date of execution and continue until April 30, 2014. Compensation shall not exceed \$150,000.
18. Construction Contract Agreement with Interwest Construction, Inc. for the Anderson/LaVenture Road Extension Projects Cedardale to Blodgett Skagit County #ES71000-1, Federal Aid #STPUS-7337(005), TIB #9-W-029(002)-1, Blodgett to Blackburn Skagit County #ES71000-1B, Federal Aid #STPUS-7337(004), TIB #9-W-029(002)-1, and South LaVenture Sanitary Sewer System City of Mount Vernon #ES97-72. The Agreement shall commence on the date of execution and continue until complete. Compensation shall not exceed \$7,776,592.60.

k) ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES:

19. Resolution authorizing the ratification of a Personal Services with Robert K. Weidner to serve as the Washington, D.C. government relations advisor for Skagit County and other counties of the

Evergreen Forest County Group. Ongoing contract negotiations delayed the execution of the Agreement prior to the commencement date of January 1, 2012.

20. Personal Services Agreement with Robert K. Weidner to serve as the Washington, D.C. government relations advisor for Skagit County and other counties of the Evergreen Forest County Group. The Agreement commenced on January 1, 2012, and shall continue until December 31, 2012. Compensation shall not exceed \$10,000.

1) PUBLIC WORKS:

21. Resolution authorizing the ratification of an Interlocal Agreement with Washington State University (WSU) to perform Task 3: WSU Beach Watchers, one of five tasks identified in the Washington Department of Ecology Grant Agreement No. G1200389, Skagit County Contract No. C20120045. Due to the time required to fully execute the grant and Interlocal Agreement and the need to begin work as soon as possible, it was necessary to obtain authorization from Skagit County Public Works staff in order to allow the work to start on the effective date of January 1, 2012.

22. Interlocal Cooperative Agreement with Washington State University (WSU) to perform Task 3: WSU Beach Watchers, one of five tasks identified in the Washington Department of Ecology Grant Agreement No. G1200389, Skagit County Contract No. C20120045. The Agreement commenced on January 1, 2012, and shall continue until June 30, 2012. Compensation shall not exceed \$13,000, which is 100% funded by Department of Ecology Grant No. G1200389.
