b) PARKS, RECREATION AND FAIR:

4. Personal Services Agreement with Ron Stubbs Comedy Hypnotist to perform two (2) stage show sets, a minimum of sixty (60) minutes each, on Wednesday, August 10, Thursday, August 11, and Friday, August 12, 2016. The Agreement shall commence on August 10, 2016, and continue until August 12, 2016. Compensation shall be based on \$433.33 per stage show set of a minimum of 60 minutes each and shall not exceed \$2,600, including sales tax.
5. Personal Services Agreement with Washington Trails Association (WTA) to provide trail maintenance volunteers, tools and the necessary crew leaders to train the volunteers in the techniques of trail maintenance and construction for twelve (12) volunteer work events at Tursi Trail on Fidalgo Island in Anacortes. The goal of both parties is that the twelve (12) work events shall consist of ten (10) to fifteen (15) volunteers with an average of 100 hours per event. The Agreement shall commence on the date of execution and continue until March 31, 2017. At the conclusion of twelve (12) work events, WTA shall be eligible for reimbursement of its expenses at the rate of \$750 per event for a total compensation amount not to exceed \$9,000.

c) PUBLIC HEALTH:

6. Resolution to call for a public hearing regarding the final report for the Public Service Grant component of the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG). The Skagit County Board of Commissioners approved a 2015-2016 application for Community Development Block Grant funding in which Community Action of Skagit County provided public services and the application was awarded. Community Action of Skagit County provided the staffing referral coordination at the East County Resources Center. The CDBG process requires that a public hearing in which a final report on the program be given. The public hearing is scheduled to take place on Tuesday, August 9, 2016, at 9:30 a.m., or as soon thereafter as possible, in the Skagit County Commissioners' Hearing Room.
7. Resolution to appoint the following members to the Low Income Housing and Homeless Housing Services Allocations Committee: Susan Toquinto, behavioral health services representative; Kyle Reep, business community representative; Jere LaFollette, college-level education representative; Debra Lancaster, community representative; Carol Hawk, health care representative; Rinny Shelton, homeless services representative; Jennifer Johnson, public health representative; and Connie Martin, school district representative. The Low Income Housing and Homeless Housing Services Allocations Committee develops a plan for the annual allocation of funds.
8. Interlocal Cooperative Agreement with the City of Mount Vernon to set forth the duties between the City and County regarding a two-year pilot program (Program) that hires an Embedded Social Worker (ESW) to respond to a variety of street-level social issues. The ESW shall be embedded within the City's Police Department with the goal to provide an alternative police response through outreach and engagement to homeless individuals with behavioral health disorders (mental and/or substance use disorders), health service or other needs within the City. The Agreement shall commence on the date of execution and continue until June 22, 2018. During the term of the Program, the County shall reimburse the City for service provided by the ESW in an amount not to exceed \$120,000 and fund up to \$10,000 of the cost of contracting with a Licensed Independent Clinical Social Worker as defined by RCW 18.225.090 (a)(ii). The City shall provide up to \$60,000 in funding for the ESW and provide funding to cover any remaining costs.

d) PUBLIC WORKS:

9. Personal Services Agreement with Innovative Environments, LLC to support the Public Works Department in the management and administration of the Forestry Program. Tasks

include preparing agendas, attending meetings, written minutes, reports and/or summaries related to the Forestry Advisory Board (FAB); timber; fish; wildlife; funding for Secure Rural Schools and Payment in Lieu of Taxes (PILT); trust lands; federal lands, and legislation. The Agreement shall commence on the date of execution and continue until June 30, 2017. Compensation shall not exceed \$73,000 and is based on a fee schedule.

10. Resolution to authorize closure of Fox Road #06490 at milepost 0.5 for the purpose of replacing a failed culver. The Road will be closed for approximately four (4) days, beginning on approximately July 18, 2016, or dates thereabout to be determined by the County Engineer.

Review of the contract provisions delayed finalization of the Agreement.
12. The Agreement commenced on July 1, 2016, and shall continue until June 30, 2017. f) SHERIFF:

13. Resolution authorizing the ratification of Interagency Agreement No. K12102 with the Washington State Patrol (WSP) for overtime reimbursement for one detective's participation in operations coordinated between WSP and the Skagit County Interlocal Drug Enforcement Unit (SCIDEU). The Agreement was delayed due to the need for WSP to finalize the reimbursement budget.
14. Interagency Agreement No. K12102 with the Washington State Patrol (WSP) for overtime reimbursement for one detective's participation in operations coordinated between WSP and the Skagit County Interlocal Drug Enforcement Unit (SCIDEU). The Agreement commenced on July 1, 2016, and shall continue until June 30, 2017. SCIDEU shall reimburse WSP for actual overtime costs in an amount not to exceed \$9,000.
15. Resolution authorizing the ratification of a Personal Services Agreement with Public Safety Selection, PC to provide psychological examinations for potential and existing employees of the Skagit County Sheriff's Office. Review of the contract's terms and conditions delayed finalization of the Agreement.
16. Personal Services Agreement with Public Safety Selection, PC to provide psychological examinations for potential and existing employees of the Skagit County Sheriff's Office. The Agreement commenced on March 1, 2016, and shall continue until December 31, 2021. Compensation shall not exceed \$375 per psychological exam plus any fees incurred in mailing or delivery for the calendar year 2016. Session rates will be determined according to established rates thereafter.
17. Resolution authorizing the ratification of Organized Crime Drug Enforcement Task Forces (OCDETF) Investigation/Strategic Initiative Numbers PA-WAW-0307 and PA-WAW-0308 for the purpose of receiving reimbursement for costs incurred by the Skagit County Sheriff's Office in providing resources to joint operations/task forces. Authorization of funding from OCDETF delayed receipt of Agreement Numbers PA-WAW-0307 and PA-WAW-0308.
18. Organized Crime Drug Enforcement Task Forces (OCDETF) Investigation/Strategic Initiative Number PA-WAW-0307 for the purpose of receiving reimbursement for costs incurred by the Skagit County Sheriff's Office in providing resources to joint operations/task forces. The

Agreement commenced on June 6, 2016, and shall continue until September 30, 2016.
OCDETF shall reimburse Skagit County in an amount not to exceed \$5,000.

19. Organized Crime Drug Enforcement Task Forces (OCDETF) Investigation/Strategic Initiative Number PA-WAW-0308 for the purpose of receiving reimbursement for costs incurred by the Skagit County Sheriff's Office in providing resources to joint operations/task forces. The Agreement commenced on June 6, 2016, and shall continue until September 30, 2016. OCDETF shall reimburse Skagit County in an amount not to exceed \$5,000.
