IV. CONSENT AGENDA FOR MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 19, 2011 (items 1 through 14):

a) COMMISSIONERS' OFFICE:

b) COMMUNITY SERVICES:

3. Personal Services Agreement with Compass Health to provide chemical dependency treatment and support services, generally in the outpatient setting to eligible persons as part of the Prevention, Intervention, Treatment and Aftercare program. The Agreement shall commence on October 1, 2011, and continue until June 30, 2012. Compensation shall not exceed \$30,000. Funding is provided through the Division of Behavioral Health and Recovery (DBHR) and the 1/10 sales tax.
4. Personal Services Agreement with SeaMar Behavioral Health to provide chemical dependency treatment and support services. The Agreement shall commence on October 1, 2011, and continue until June 30, 2012. Compensation shall not exceed \$180,000. Funding is provided through the Division of Behavioral Health and Recovery (DBHR) and the 1/10 sales tax.
5. Interlocal Cooperative Agreement with Northwest Educational Service District 189 (NWESD), in which NWESD will provide training for all participating schools in Adverse Childhood Experience (ACE) and the Attachment, Self-Regulation, and Competency (ARC) model. The Agreement shall commence on September 21, 2011, and continue through June 30, 2013. Compensation shall not exceed \$19,712, which is funded with the 2011-2013 Ready to Learn (RTL) grant.

c) COUNTY CLERK:

6. Interlocal Agreement with the Washington State Department of Corrections (DOC) to establish terms and conditions under which the County agrees to allow electronic access to adult criminal, non-confidential, documents on a subscription basis. The Agreement shall commence on the date of execution and continue until June 30, 2012. Compensation shall not exceed \$1,000.

d) HEALTH:

7. Amendment No. 32 to Washington State Department of Health Consolidated Contract No. C14962, Skagit County Contract No. C20070142. The purpose this Amendment is to add Statement of Work for the Human Immunodeficiency Virus (HIV) and Adult Viral Hepatitis Prevention (Needle Exchange) programs. This Amendment also modifies the Statement of Work for the Children with Special Health Care Needs (CSHCN) Outcomes Project, the Immunization Program CHILD Profile, and the Material & Child Health program. This Amendment increases compensation by \$54,272, for a new compensation amount not to exceed \$4,427,687. All other terms and conditions of the original Agreement and subsequent Amendments shall remain in effect.
8. Internet Vehicle/Vessel Information Processing System (IVIPS) Disclosure Agreement with the Washington State Department of Licensing (DOL) DOL Account No. 335568 to provide staff with access to the DOL IVIPS. The Agreement shall commence upon the date of execution and continue until September 30, 2012. The County shall pay \$0.04 for each internet query, and \$0.15 for each request in writing or by telephone.

e) INFORMATION SERVICES:

9. Customer Software License Agreement with Creative Information Systems, Inc., for the SMS Turbo Software being used at the Ovenell Transfer Station. The Agreement shall commence upon the execution and shall continue until terminated.

f) PROSECUTING ATTORNEY:

10. Estoppel Certificate from tenant relating to the building leased by the Family Support Division of the Prosecuting Attorney's office, located at Suite 203, 208 E. Blackburn Road in Mount Vernon. The leased premises will be sold by State Street Retail Center, LLC to Business Bank. State Street Retail Center will assign the Lease Agreement between Skagit County and State Street Retail Center to Business Bank. The purpose of this Certificate is to reiterate the terms of the lease that will remain in full force and effect upon the sale.

g) PUBLIC WORKS:

11. Resolution regarding the closure of Farm to Market Road, No. 31010, at milepost 0.650 for 14 days to replace a culvert on or about October 3, through October 16, 2011.
12. Joint Funding Agreement with U.S. Geological Survey to operate, help maintain, and publish data from several gauge stations on the Skagit and Sauk Rivers. The Agreement shall commence on October 1, 2011, and continue until September 30, 2012. The County's portion of the total fixed cost of \$45,815 shall not exceed \$33,905.

h) SHERIFF:

13. Agreement for the procurement of a patrol boat from Safe Boats International, LLC. The Agreement shall commence upon the date of execution. Upon receipt of a fully executed and approved contract, Safe Boats International will commence design and procurement of material within 10 days and deliver completed boat at or within 180 days. Compensation shall not exceed \$539,641.34, and will be funded through Port Security Grant Program (PSGP) Award No. 2010-PU-T0-K033-22, Skagit County PSGP FY10 Memorandum of Agreement No. C20110056.
14. Amendment No. 1 to Agreement for the procurement of a patrol boat from Safe Boats International, LLC. The purpose of this Amendment is to amend Section 1.13 "Payment" and its subsections. Compensation remains at an amount not to exceed \$539,641.34. All other terms and conditions of the original Agreement shall remain in effect.

i) HEALTH:

15. Resolution authorizing the ratification of an Interagency Agreement No. C1200107 with the Washington State Department of Ecology to provide funding to continue the Waste Tire Disposal grant program. A finalized Agreement was delayed due to negotiations to continue the Waste Tire Disposal grant.

19. Resolution authorizing the ratification of a Personal Services Agreement with Dennis Scott, Attorney at Law. A signed contract was not processed prior to the commencement of services on September 1, 2011.
20. Personal Services Agreement with Dennis Scott, Attorney at Law, to provide consultation and representation for mental health, voluntary commitment hearings, and jury trials in conjunction with Mari Doerner, Attorney at Law. The Agreement commenced on September 1, 2011, and shall continue until August 31, 2012. Compensation shall not exceed \$100,000.

k) PUBLIC WORKS:

21. Resolution authorizing the ratification of a Testing Services Agreement with Oregon State University for the purchase of fecal coli form source identification services in support of the Clean Samish Initiative. A finalized Agreement was delayed due to contract negotiations.
22. Testing Services Agreement with the Oregon State University for the purchase of fecal coliform source identification laboratory testing services related to the Clean Samish Initiative Pollution Identification Correction Program. The Agreement commenced on March 1, 2011, and shall continue until December 31, 2011. Compensation shall not exceed \$10,000.
