

SKAGIT COUNTY DISTRICT COURT PROBATION

**DEFERRED PROSECUTION REQUIREMENTS**

FAILURE TO FOLLOW THESE RULES WILL RESULT IN ME BEING CHARGED WITH A VIOLATION IN COURT, WHICH COULD RESULT IN AN ORDER TO REVOKE.

1. Follow all instructions given and make and keep all appointments required by the Skagit County District Court Probation Department, 205 West Kincaid St., Room 301, Courthouse, Mount Vernon, WA 98273. Phone: (360) 336-9372.
2. Report immediately any change in my mailing address to the Probation Department (Phone: {360} 336-9372) AND the Skagit County District Court (Phone: {360} 336-9319) so that I can be easily contacted by mail.
3. Fill out, and sign a **Treatment Provider Authorization** so that the Probation Department can receive progress reports from the agency providing my treatment.
4. Follow all treatment requirements as set forth in my Deferred Prosecution Order, and:
  - A. Report promptly to the probation department any problems in complying with my treatment program.
  - B. Make arrangements to pay the costs of this program. I UNDERSTAND THAT I WILL NOT RECEIVE COMPLIANCE CREDIT UNLESS THESE ARRANGEMENTS ARE MADE AND KEPT TO THE SATISFACTION OF MY TREATMENT PROVIDER.
  - C. Understand that the treatment provider will notify the probation department within 30 days of any failure on my part to comply with my treatment program.
  - D. Understand that I cannot change my treatment provider without permission of the court which I must ask for by contacting the probation department.
5. Not consume any alcohol or any mind altering drug unless it is prescribed by a licensed physician or dentist if my court order requires me to complete any chemical dependency treatment program (alcohol included). I understand that this requirement begins at the time the judge signs my court order and continues through the last day my court order is in effect. Submit to random breath and UA tests if the Probation Department suspects I am in violation of the order. Failure to take the test is considered a refusal.
6. Be aware that the Probation Department completes a standard criminal history record search and obtains a copy of my Driving Abstract Record to determine if I have had any new criminal violations of the law. I further understand that if I am convicted of or found on probable cause to have committed any criminal offense I may be removed from Deferred Prosecution and sentenced accordingly.
7. Follow all instructions given by the Probation Department if I am required to pay restitution for damages.

8. Provide documentation to show that I have done the following concerning my driving privileges:
  - A. Provide photocopies to the Probation Department that show I have both a valid Washington Driver's License and liability insurance (if I have a vehicle registered in my name). These papers will contain the following information:
    - (1) Name and address of the insurance company
    - (2) Insurance policy number
    - (3) Expiration date of insurance policy
    - (4) Photocopy of driver's license
  - B. Provide photocopy proof to the probation department, each time my insurance policy and/or driver's license expires, that I have renewed them both. If I do not provide updated information as required the Driving Pledge will be placed into effect.
  - C. Sign the **DRIVING PLEDGE** and return it to the Probation Department within **10 days** from the date it was mailed to me. I know that by signing this document if I have not provided proof of having both a valid Drivers License and Insurance to the probation department, and I am charged with and/or convicted of a new driving offense, I may be subject to having my Deferred Prosecution Order revoked and I will be convicted of the offense under this cause.
9. Comply with any appointment request from the Probation Department by scheduling and keeping an appointment within the time required.
10. Follow all instructions given to me by the District Court if I am required to attend the DUI Victim Panel Program.
11. Understand that if I wish to relocate to another state, and I meet certain criteria, I must first obtain permission to relocate from the Washington State Department of Corrections. If I want to relocate, I begin the process by contacting Skagit County District Court Probation and telling my Probation Officer. The Officer will determine if I am eligible for a transfer and advise me what steps to take.
