## Training & Education Workgroup



## Skagit County AED Registry – **FOURTH** Announcement!

The purpose of the Registry is to let us (and 9-1-1) know where all the AEDs in the County are located. The registry will also send reminders to the AED owners prior to expiration of pads and batteries. This will help ensure that AEDs are ready to go when needed.



As of Friday 10/09 we've received 38 AED registry forms. Below is a screen shot of geographical locations of those 38 AEDs (some locations may have more than one if, for example, there is an AED on a fire truck and another on an aid unit in the same location). We will be sharing the map with the County Commissioners on camera on Tuesday, October 20, and we'd really like to have all the fire department / district AEDs in the registry by then.

The Skagit AED Registry is a free service to all AED owners. The purpose of the Registry is let us know where in the county the AED's are. This also will send reminders to the owners and our registry prior to expiration dates of pads, batteries. AED owners can decide to make the AED public or private. If by making the AED public you allow the system to notify responders of the location of your AED if it is within 1,200 feet of the cardiac arrest. This can help save a life. Good Samaritan Laws protect users and responders. Owners of the AED's are also protected as long as the AED is maintained. The Registry will support keeping AED electrodes and batteries current.

All AED's in our system will have red sticker that says SKAGIT AED REGISTRY and a number.
