


Town Finder Criss-Cross Puzzle © Skagit County Historical Museum

4. Originally a major village site for the Kik-i-allus tribe
5. Rival city to Atlanta on Samish Island
9. Once the largest metropolis in the Skagit area
11. Once had a newspaper called "The Avon Record"
12. City that began where 2 rivers joined at the starting point of the "tote road"
14. This town was to be a "sanctuary for persecuted Confederates".
15. City was a mining trading post during the 1890's gold rush
16. Named after a man who settled on the east shore of Big Lake.
17. This 8.5 mile island was a great place to visit, but few would ever live there
18. Town inside Anacortes platted by Reverend Tade who also founded the Alden Academy

1. Town first called Deception and Fidalgo City before getting named after a Spanish American War Admiral
2. City fostering good will to the poor, sick or aged
3. Logging supply town whose waterfront burned down in 1910 and was never replaced.
4. This town once boasted the states most extensive quantity of coking coal
6. Named after a popular family that also founded a dance hall
7. This town once had 7 mills to its name
8. 13 families from Finland settled here becoming the first skiers of Skagit County
10. Town named after Ytterhogdal, the Swedish settlers home town.
13. Opened the first store and hotel on Mann's Landing in 1876
