Captain and Inspirational Award Winner for the 1969 Ingraham High School Rams who were Metro League and undefeated State Champions. In the State final, I hit two of the last three shots and blocked a shot with 2 seconds left to win the game in front of 10,000 people.

Recruited by several division 1 schools.

This Ingraham team was honored in November, at halftime of the UW-Seattle U game, as one of the greatest teams to ever play in the State of Washington. My Senior year, we averaged 85 a game and held our opponents to 55. We scored 116 against a very good team and that was with no Senior playing the last quarter. We played in Seattle's Metro League, the toughest league in the State. We also had 5 players who could dunk, which for 1969 is not bad.
