Notice is hereby given that on February 7, 2000 the Washington State Department of Transportation (WSDOT) filed for a Shoreline Substantial Development/Variance and a Special Use Permit application to allow the following development. WSDOT in partnership with Universal Communications Network proposes to construct, operate and maintain a portion of a fiber optic cable in the Interstate 5 right of way and associated facilities. The optic facility will include a backbone consisting of 12-18 plastic conduits buried 3 to 10 feet under ground and a regeneration station to be located at the Bow Hill Area Rest Area.

The proposed project extends across the entire county on Interstate 5 right-of-way. The proposal is located within a portion of section 1 of Township 36 North, Range 3 East, sections 7,18,19,30, and 31 of Township 36 North, Range 4 East, sections 6,7,18,19,30 and 31 of Township 35 North, Range 4 East, sections 29 and 32 of Township 34 North and Range 4 East, sections 5,6,7,18,20,17,19,20,29,32,and 33 of Township 33 East, Range 4 East, W.M., Skagit County. The subject proposal is located in a Rural shoreline designation under the Shoreline Management Master Program.

Completed applications are on file with the Skagit County Planning & Permit Center. This information is available to the public on request.
