



# Centennial Trail (Big Rock to Clear Lake) Project




<b>Project Description:</b>	<p>Skagit County is in the process of surveying a 3.5-mile long portion of Skagit County owned property for a multi-use trail (Centennial Trail) that will connect the City of Mount Vernon to the Community of Clear Lake. The project includes construction of a trail head and parking facility in the area of Big Rock where SR-538 and SR-9 intersect. From there, we will utilize an existing abandoned railroad grade that runs north and south adjacent to SR-9, the trail will move north and will continue through Clear Lake and end near the Clear Lake Elementary School. The trail construction will include two pedestrian bridges, a 10-foot wide paved surface for bicycle and pedestrian use, and an unpaved 6-foot wide section for equestrian use.</p>
