

SAMPLE BALLOT

INSTRUCTIONS

1. VOTE ONLY ONE BALLOT

2. Only use pencil to mark your ballot.

3. You must completely blacken the oval to the left of your desired selection.

4. Separate ballots have been provided for each political party, plus a nonpartisan ballot.

5. You must choose only one ballot to vote. Though party affiliation is inferred by choosing a political party ballot, NO RECORD will be made of the ballot you choose.

6. If you vote more than one political party ballot, none of your votes for political party candidates will count.

7. All partisan ballots include a nonpartisan section. You may vote a nonpartisan ballot section, regardless of any party affiliation. Nonpartisan means offices without a political party label or ballot propositions.

8. If you vote for nonpartisan candidates on a partisan ballot, return ONLY the voted partisan ballot - do NOT return the separate nonpartisan ballot.

9. To write-in a candidate you must write their name on the line provided under the desired position. Only write-in candidates for the Libertarian party. Do not write-in candidates from other partisan ballots.

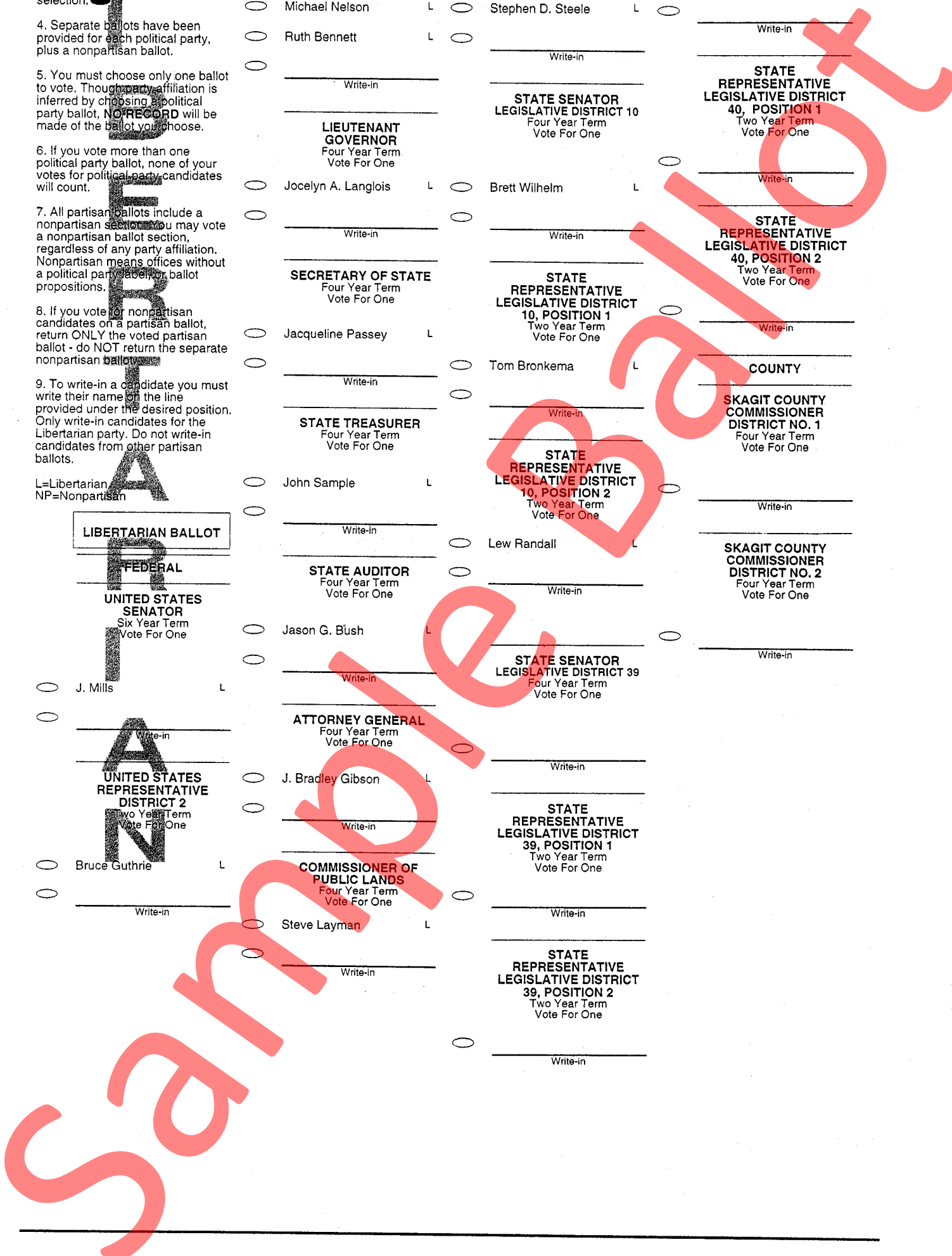

SKAGIT COUNTY FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT NO. 3 PROPOSITION NO. 1

AUTHORIZING REGULAR PROPERTY TAX LEVY INCREASE

The Board of Fire Commissioners of Fire Protection District No. 3, Skagit County, Washington, adopted Resolution No. 1-2004 authorizing a regular property tax levy of \$1.00 per \$1,000. This proposition would authorize the District to set and maintain a regular property tax levy of \$1.00 per \$1,000 of assessed valuation for 2005 and thereafter pursuant to RCW 84.55.050 and subject to any otherwise applicable statutory dollar rate limitations. SKAGIT COUNTY FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT NO. 7 PROPOSITION NO. 1

AUTHORIZING REGULAR PROPERTY TAX LEVY INCREASE

SNOHOMISH COUNTY FIRE DISTRICT NO. 24 PROPOSITION NO. 1

EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES SIX YEAR PROPERTY TAX LEVY

PUBLIC HOSPITAL DISTRICT NO. 2 HOSPITAL IMPROVEMENT GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS - \$30,500,000

The Commission of Public Hospital District No. 2 adopted Resolution No. 1286 concerning a proposition to finance improvements to Island Hospital. The improvements include (i) remodeling and expanding the Hospital's emergency room (ii) constructing, furnishing and equipping new flexible use inpatient rooms, (iii) relocating and expanding the hospital's ancillary services such as radiology and laboratory and (iv) making other related capital improvements. Approval of the proposition would authorize issuance of up to \$30,500,000 of general obligation bonds maturing within twenty-five years and the levy of annual excess property taxes to pay and retire the bonds.
