PUBLIC HOSPITAL DISTRICT NO. 2 HOSPITAL IMPROVEMENT GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS - \$30,500,000

The Commission of Public Hospital District No. 2 adopted Resolution No. 1286 concerning a proposition to finance improvements to Island Hospital.
