GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS:

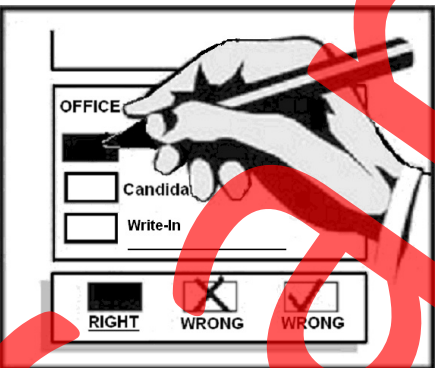
- Use a black or blue ink pen to mark your choices on the ballot.
- To vote your choice in each contest, completely fill in the box to the left of your choice as shown in the example below.
- More than one vote in a contest will be an overvote and no votes for that contest will be counted.
- If you make an error, please "X" out the incorrect vote and mark the box for the correct choice.
- If you sign or otherwise identify yourself on the ballot, the ballot will not be counted.
- Remember: ballot drop-off locations close at 8:00 PM sharp -- ballots received after that time will not be counted!
- This ballot must be returned or postmarked by election day!

PRESIDENTIAL PRIMARY INSTRUCTIONS:

This ballot contains major political party candidates for partisan offices; depending on where you live, your ballot may also contain additional nonpartisan ballot measures. For partisan offices, you may vote for candidates of only one political party. Regardless of whether you vote for partisan offices, you may vote for the nonpartisan ballot measures. Please follow these instructions:

1. Select one political party. If you do not select a party, or if you select more than one party, your votes for partisan offices will not be counted.
2. Vote only for candidates of the party you select. Votes for another party's candidates will not be counted.
3. Vote for ballot measures if they appear on your ballot. These votes will be counted even if you do not select a political party.

PROPOSITION NO. 1 ANACORTES SCHOOL DISTRICT #103

GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS - \$62,900,000

The Board of Directors of Anacortes School District No. 103 approved Resolution No. 729 concerning this proposition for bonds. This proposition authorizes the District to modernize and expand Anacortes High School and Mount Erie Elementary School, make technology improvements, construct a new maintenance facility, acquire land and make other capital improvements; to issue \$62,900,000 of general obligation bonds maturing within a maximum term of 20 years; and to levy excess property taxes annually to repay the bonds, as described in Resolution #729.
