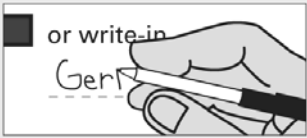
Use a dark blue or black ink pen to completely fill in the box to the left of your choice. Vote for one in each race. If you vote for more than one, no votes will be counted for that race.
