

Dear Skagit County Voters,

Effective July 1, 2021, each county in Washington will produce a Voters' Pamphlet for all elections. The information in this Voters' Pamphlet is also available online at skagitcounty.net/elections.

To ensure that your ballot is counted please remember the following:

- Return your voted ballot quickly
- Use a ballot drop box whenever possible
- If you return your ballot via US Postal Service, make sure it is postmarked by Primary Election Day, August 3, 2021
- Sign your return ballot envelope

Our Elections Team is made up of dedicated professionals who work hard to make sure that every vote is counted. If there is a question about your signature not matching the State's voter registration database, we will send you a letter asking you to update your signature. If you receive one of these letters, please return your updated signature by email, mail, or come into our office, as soon as possible.

If you still need to register to vote, you can do that online at VoteWA.gov until July 26th. After July 26th and until 8:00pm on August 3rd, you can register and vote at our Elections Office: 700 S. Second Street, Room 201, Mount Vernon. If you have any questions, please email our office at scelections@co.skagit.wa.us or call 360-416-1702.


How to vote



Use a dark blue or black ink pen to completely fill in the box to the left of your choice.

Vote for one in each race. If you vote for more than one, no votes will be counted for that race.

If you make a mistake



Draw a line through the entire measure response or candidate's name.

Then you may make another choice.

Optional write-in

To vote for a candidate not listed for that race, fill in the box to the left of the dashed line and print the name on the line.

NO STAMP needed to return your ballot

- View the voters' pamphlet online at www.skagitcounty.net/elections
- Tear off the ballot stub and throw it away.
- Vote your ballot...
 - Use a blue or black ink pen to mark your ballot.
 - Leave a contest blank if you want your ballot will still count.
 - Put your voted ballot in the secrecy sleeve.
 - Put the secrecy sleeve in the return envelope.
 - Seal the return envelope.
 - Sign and date the declaration on the return envelope. If you are unable to sign, make your mark and have it witnessed by TWO people. Ensure that both people sign the envelope.
 - A power of attorney cannot be used to sign a ballot.
 - Place your ballot in a ballot drop-box ...
 - Deposit your ballot in a drop-box. Drop-boxes are picked up by Elections department staff, not the USPS. See drop-box locations on the next page.
 - Drop-boxes are open 20 days before Election Day. They remain open 24 hours a day until 8:00 PM Election Night.
 - Skagit County Elections strongly encourages using drop-boxes.
- Or return your ballot by mail...
 - -NO STAMP required if mailed in the U.S.
 - Ballots sent by USPS **MUST** be postmarked no later than Election Day
- Contact Skagit County Elections...
 - If you've lost, spoiled, or destroyed your ballot; or
 - To learn about the locations, hours, and services of voting centers and ballot drop-boxes, including the availability of accessible voting equipment.

Your signature matters.

Under Washington State law, the signature on your ballot return envelope must match the signature from your voter registration record in order for your ballot to be counted. That means we check every single signature on every single return envelope in every single election. Each election, ballots are returned either unsigned or with a signature that doesn't quite match. Don't let that be you.

Here are a few tips to help make sure your signature passes the check and your ballot gets counted:

- If you register online, we pull your signature from the Dept. of Licensing, so check the signature on your drivers license or state ID and try to match that as closely as you can.
- Your signature does not need to be written in cursive or nicely or even legibly, it just needs to match the one that we already have on file. If you have a chicken scratch signature, that's okay! Just make sure you scratch it out the same way each time you vote.
- If you have no idea what signature you might have used or it's been a while and your signature has changed, you can always update your signature simply by returning a paper voter registration form. Returning a paper registration form will add your updated signature to your file.

If there is an issue with your signature not matching or if you just plain forgot to sign, we will send you a letter and, if we have your number, we'll reach out by phone as well. To make sure your ballot is counted, you'll need to fill out and return a simple form before 4:30 pm on Monday, August 16.



When will I fill out my ballot?

Life is busy. You've got a lot on your plate. We get it. Making a plan to vote can help make sure that you get your ballot in on time so your vote can be counted and your voice can be heard.

Ballots will be mailed on July 14. If you don't receive your ballot, call Skagit County Elections at 360-416-1702 or go online to print your ballot at votewa.gov.


