Proposition No. 1 Property Tax Levy for Fire Protection and Emergency Medical Services

The Board of Skagit County Fire Protection District No. 3 adopted Resolution No. 3-2022 concerning a proposition to maintain and adequately fund District operations. This proposition authorizes the District to restore its 2022 regular property tax levy to \$.79 per \$1,000.00 of assessed valuation (collected in 2023) and authorizes adjustments by the greater of 1% or the CPI-W for Seattle-Tacoma-Bellevue as reported in June of the levy year for each of the five succeeding years. The maximum allowable levy in 2027 (collected in 2028) shall serve as the base for subsequent levy limitations as provided by Chapter 84.55 RCW.

Proposition No. 1 Restoring Regular Property Tax Levy
