DRINKING WATER SYSTEM STATUS REPORT

I, the undersigned property owner, in making an application for a building permit (BP06-1243) involving a singlefamily residence acknowledge that this notice is being signed, notarized and recorded in compliance with Skagit County Code Section 12.48.270 in regards to a drinking water quality parameter that exceeds the maximum contaminant level but is treatable to below the maximum contaminant level WA06-0140.

- I agree to record this notice with the Skagit County Auditor's Office for the purpose of it being made a part of the record of title.

 I understand that this notice will expear on any title search or record search, and we have no objection nor will we make claims against Skaga county as a consequence of this recording. 2.
- The drinking water source for this esidential building is located in an area exhibiting relic seawater. The 3. inorganic chemistry taken on June 8,2002 yielded conductivity levels exceeding the maximum contaminant level (MCL) for drinking water STEE levels noted on the date of sampling were: Conductivity 804 (MCL =700 u ohins). A senic 016 ppm, and a sodium level of 162 Mg/l was also detected. While no MCL has been established for sodium 200 mg/l is the maximum level recommended for Healthy adults. Post treatment results taken on October 10, 2007 after treatment by a GE Smartwater GXRM10G treatment system were: Conductivity 87.9 u ohms, Arsenic ND and Sodium 15.1 mg/L. High levels of sodium may cause health problems for infants and people with cardiac, circulatory or renal diseases. The American Heart Association recommends a maximum level of 20 mg/l for individuals needing to reduce their salt intake. The Health Officer recommends that property owners exercise caution in the use of this drinking water system by:
 - conserving drinking water use where possible by installing low water use fixtures and limiting a. landscape watering as the well yields .41g/m,
 - future rental use will be require treatment in compliance with SCC 12.48.220, b.
 - future residential development for an accessory dwelling unit (ADU) will require compliance with c. SCC 12.48.230 for quantity.
 - and owner may want to install a water treatment system or drink bottled water.
- Water systems with filed status reports will not be used for the creation of new lots. 4.
