The petitioner was present at the February 6, 2025, hearing.

This property is described as a residential home situated on .55 acres located at 4111 R Avenue, Anacortes, Skagit County, Washington. The appellant cites, Structure value going back over values since 2018 each year have INCREASED by 60,000 to 150,000 annually. Yet this year you have it decreasing by \$170,400! How is that even possible in a year that inflation has doubled every other bill. The house has been properly maintained. If this year's values are correct for a 3100 square foot building, then I expect a refund for the past year's taxes that were far over accessed. 2024-753K, 2023 -680K, 2022-530K, 2021-467K, 2020-465k, 2019-435900k, 2018-386k.

The Assessor, represented by Deputy Assessor, Doug Webb, provided an oral testimony, noting that the assessor's market evidence provided support for the current assessment. The Assessor requests the board sustain the current evaluation.

BOE members present were Rich Holtrop, Angie Bossarte, and Betta Spinelli.

The burden of proof is on the petitioner to provide clear, cogent, and convincing evidence to support the appeal. In this case, the petitioner did not submit sufficient evidence to support a value increase. Therefore, the Board finds that the petitioner has failed to overcome the evidentiary standard necessary to overrule the assessor.
