Background and Significance

- The postpartum period is a vulnerable time for parents, infants, and families.
- About 30% of maternal deaths occur postpartum, and 17 out of every 1,000 infants born worldwide die within the first month after birth.
- The Help Me Grow Newborn Outreach Program (HMG NOP) was developed as a pilot project in May of 2024.



What is the HMG Newborn Outreach Program?

 The Newborn Outreach Nurse meets with postpartum families at the Family Birth Center at Skagit Valley Hospital, provides brief educational interventions, connects families to community resources, and provides a welcome bag



The HMG Newborn Outreach Nurse has served nearly <u>400 families</u>



Purpose Statement

- Develop an evaluation process for the Help Me Grow Skagit Newborn Outreach Program (HMG NOP).
- Data from this evaluation will support the continuation of programs and partnerships that enhance maternal and child health in Skagit County



Objectives

- Identify the benefits of postpartum community support networks on the overall health of mothers, infants, and families during the first three months postpartum.
 - Completed via a literature review and evidence appraisal.
- Evaluate both patient and hospital staff experiences with the HMG Newborn Outreach Program. Identify areas for improvement and implementation.
 - Survey A (patients)
 - Survey B (hospital staff)
 - Hospital Staff Interviews

Outcomes from Patient Survey

Design: 5 questions + comment section N = 12 survey responses Response rate = 12/45 = 27%

Outcomes from Hospital Staff Survey

Design: 3 questions + comment section N = 19 survey responses Response rate = 19/68 = 28%

Conclusions

- The HMG Newborn Outreach Nurse provides community linkage and support services that are crucial for families in the early postpartum period, especially families with limited resources or those from culturally diverse backgrounds.
- The support and strategies offered by the program are evidence-based and deeply appreciated by the community.
- If additional funding sources can be identified, the majority of participants and providers would like the program to continue and expand
