COVID-19 Vaccine

- EVERYONE 6 months and older
- Get updated dose in the fall
- Updated doses expected to arrive mid Sept to October
- Local pharmacies, childhood vaccine clinics
- Call Skagit County Public Health at 360-416-1500 if you need assistance finding an appointment



Seasonal Flu Vaccine

- EVERYONE 6 months and older
- Get updated dose in the fall
- Updated doses arriving now
- Local pharmacies, childhood vaccine clinics
- Call Skagit County Public Health at 360-416-1500 if you need assistance finding an appointment



RSV Vaccine

- EVERYONE 75 years and older
- People 60-74 at increased risk of severe RSV
- Get vaccinated once, no annual dose
- Local pharmacies, clinics
- Call Skagit County Public Health at 360-416-1500 if you need assistance finding an appointment






Since October 2023 the North Sound Region has the highest death rate related to COVID in Washington

Skagit Kindergarten % complete by disease, 2023-24



Skagit Kindergarten Overall Compliance Status, 2023-24






Measles target is 95% compliance rate to prevent outbreaks




Figure 4. Percentage of 11–12-year-olds with one or more doses of HPV by county, 2023.
