




Food Security in Skagit

Workgroup Process






Skagit County has a resilient local food system that provides equitable access to nutritious, sustainable, and culturally appropriate food for all.


















Madeline McGonagle, Skagit Food Distribution Center

- Pre-season agreements with growers from Viva Farms
- Better management of inventory and waste reduction
- Pantries have access to nutritious food while supporting local producers





Michael Marques, Skagit Valley Food Co-op

- Skagit Valley Food Co-op is committed to increasing food access
- Partnership with Helping Hands to purchase bulk goods
- Reduction in hot food waste due to partnership with Skagit Gleaners
- Final stages to become a WIC authorized retailer





Lani Miller, Skagit County Public Health

- Importance of resource navigators in connecting people to support
- Partnership with Community Action and Help Me Grow
- In-person gatherings to promote networking and resource sharing
- Committed to a quarterly gatherings and continued collaboration to ensure resource sharing

- Food preservation important for stretching limited budgets and reducing waste
- Partnership with Skagit Gleaners on a food preservation series and lending library
- Twelve, hybrid workshops this year

Future Work

- Utilization of GIS mapping of food access sites to inform areas of greatest need in our community
- Creation of materials or channels to simplify food access resources in the community
- Collaboration with emergency management to develop a plan for food distribution in times of crisis
