General Overview - Fees

- Public Health is funded by grants, fees and general fund dollars.
- Last major revision 2019
- Drinking water added 2021

• Partial updates April 2023



Affected Programs

- Retail Food Safety
- Living Environment (pools, spas, camps)
- Liquid Waste On-Site Septic Systems
- Drinking Water Quality & Quantity
- Solid & Hazardous Waste



Program Work

- Review & approve facility plans and applications
- Require operating permits
- Provide education & enforcement through technical assistance, routine inspections and follow up inspections
- Investigate complaints and potential food and water borne illness cases and outbreaks



Resources Needed - People

Our most valuable resource!

- 14 FTE in Environmental Health
 - 4.5 EHS in Food Safety & Living Environment
 - 4 EHS in Liquid Waste & Drinking Water
 - 2.5 EHS in Solid & Hazardous Waste
 - 2 FTE dedicated administrative support
 - 1 EH Manager
- Initial & ongoing training to assure competency

How we cover costs

- Fees assessed based on cost to provide the service
- 2024/2025 fee schedule updates based on:
 - Actual costs of program services
 - Risk posed to the public
 - Time required to assess and inspect for these risks

Fees based on Risk & Time spent to permit and inspect



Fee Update Overview

- EH permit fees designed to support program costs
- Clarify some permit categories
- Propose moderate increases across most fees in all the programs
- Update the hourly rate
- propose annual COLA increases with periodic review



Review & Decision Process

- Solicit comments and input from public and business community
- Notify all establishments with permits of proposed changes via mail, email and website
- Hold public meetings and public hearing
- Tentative review and decision process occurring now through early 2025
