County Budget

- Counties are required by law to provide essential services, including law enforcement, prosecution, public defense, court systems, jails, elections, and property assessments.
- Property Tax, our single largest revenue source, is statutorily limited to 1% increase plus revenue from New Construction

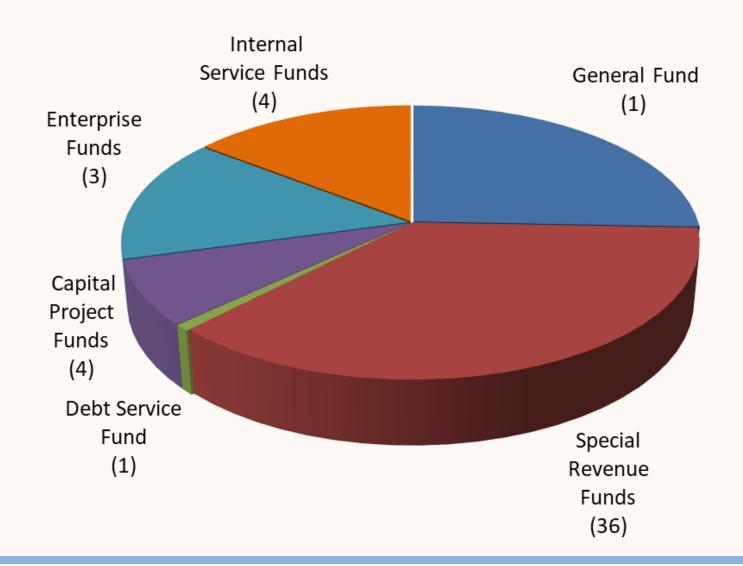

 - Principal and interest payments on debt
- Capital Funds (4)
 - Acquisition or construction of capital facilities or other assets
- Enterprise Funds (3)
 - Activities for which a fee is charged to external users
- Internal Service Funds (4)
 - Provide service within our government, or to other governments, on a cost reimbursement basis

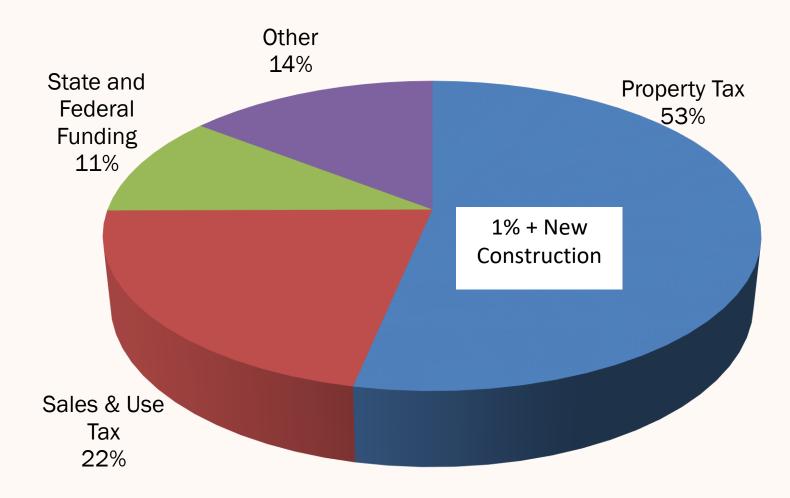

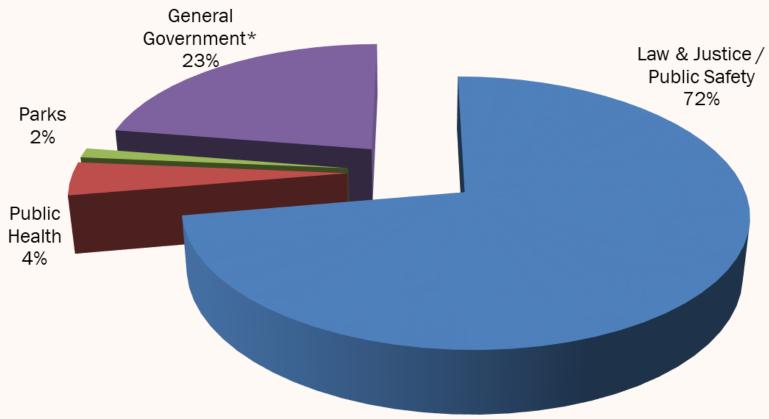


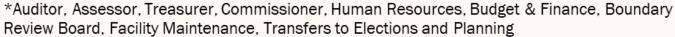
Sources of General Fund Revenue





Uses of General Fund Resources

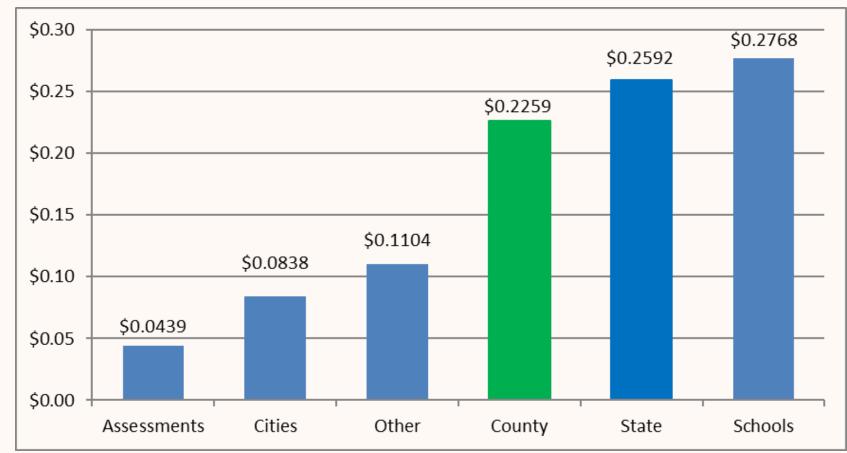






Where do our Property Taxes go?

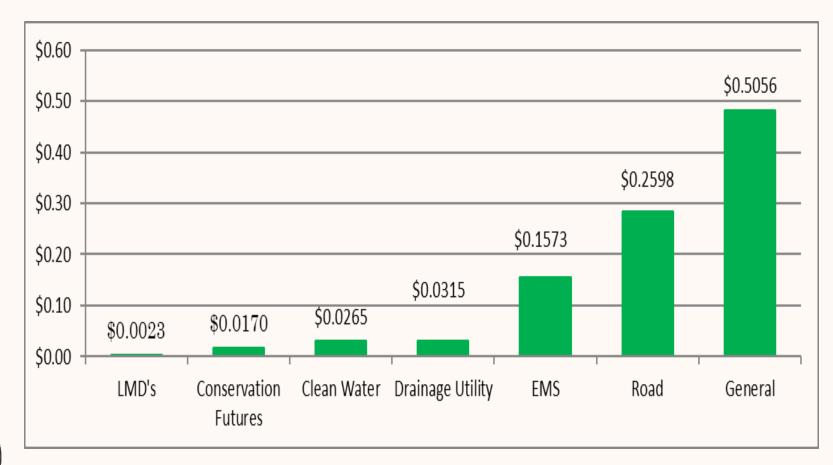

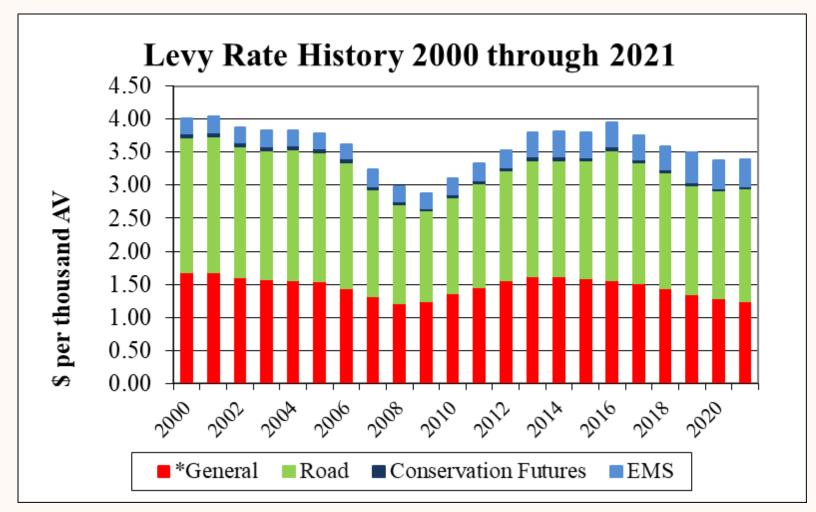
Where does the money go within the County?

2021 Budget Message:

- \$95,000 Expansion of Environmental Health and Communicable Disease division (EH Manager)
- \$177,000 Grant funding for Community Court that allows misdemeanants to access social services and support instead of the traditional legal system
- \$244,000 Jail to Community Transitions program
- \$238,000 2 IMPACT deputies funded by 1% property tax increase
- \$170,000 Uniform Guardianship Act
- \$25,000 Signature verification software for Elections
- \$1.25 million PILT funds allocated to upgrades to the courthouse
- \$500,000 Permitting Software
- \$250,000 REET funds for the development of affordable workforce housing and emergency shelter
- \$1 million Step increases and General Wage Adjustment
- \$12.4 million Continued maintenance of employee benefits
