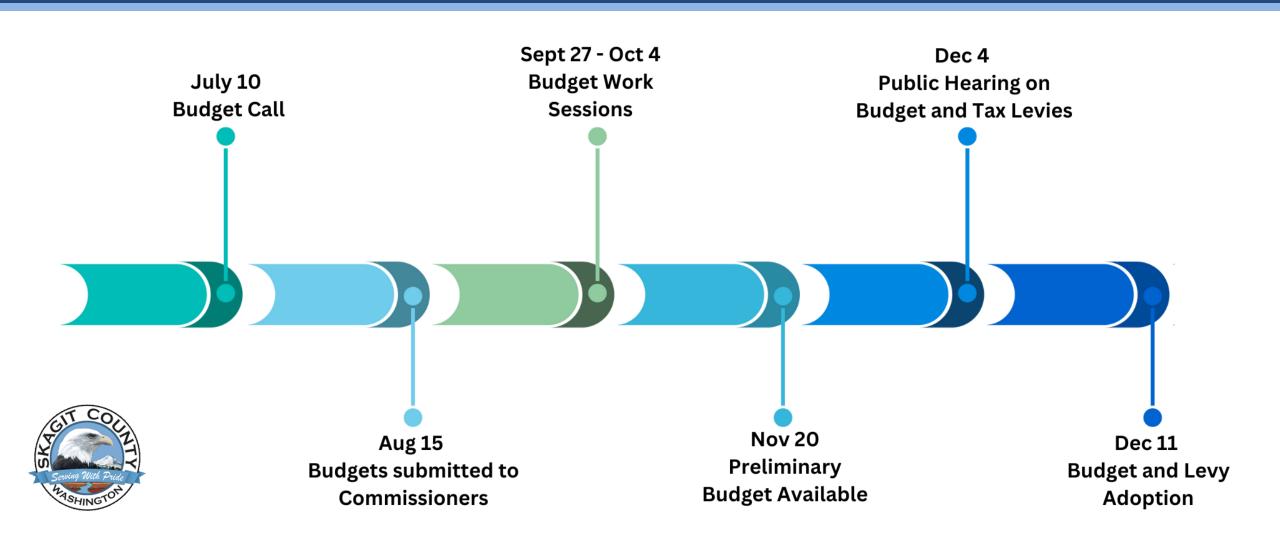

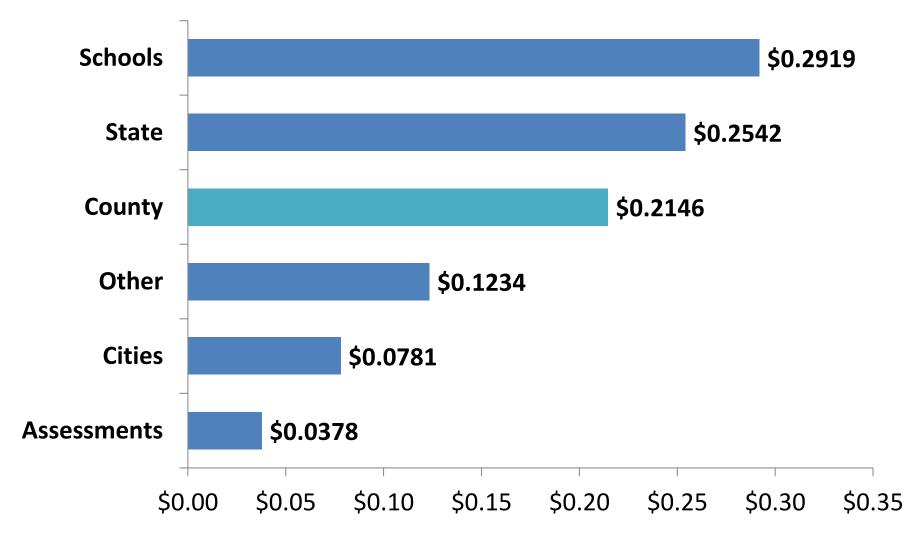

Where do our Property Taxes go?

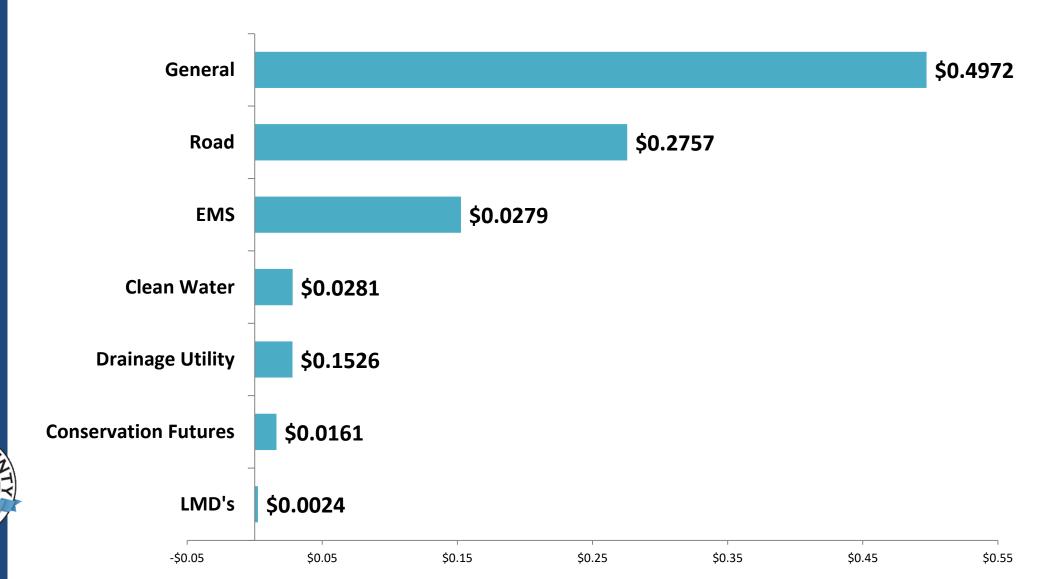
(for every \$1)

Types of County Funds (51 Total!)

- General Fund (1)
 - Everything not accounted for in a different fund
- Special Revenue Funds (37)
 - Restricted for a specific purpose other than debt or capital
 - Examples Public Health, Conservation Futures, EMS, ARPA, etc.
- Debt Service Fund (1)
 - Principal and interest payments on debt
- Capital Funds (5)
 - Acquisition or construction of capital facilities or other assets
- Enterprise Funds (3)
 - Activities for which a fee is charged to external users
- Internal Service Funds (4)
 - Provide service within our government, or to other governments, on a cost reimbursement basis.
 - Examples law library, information services, GIS, etc.



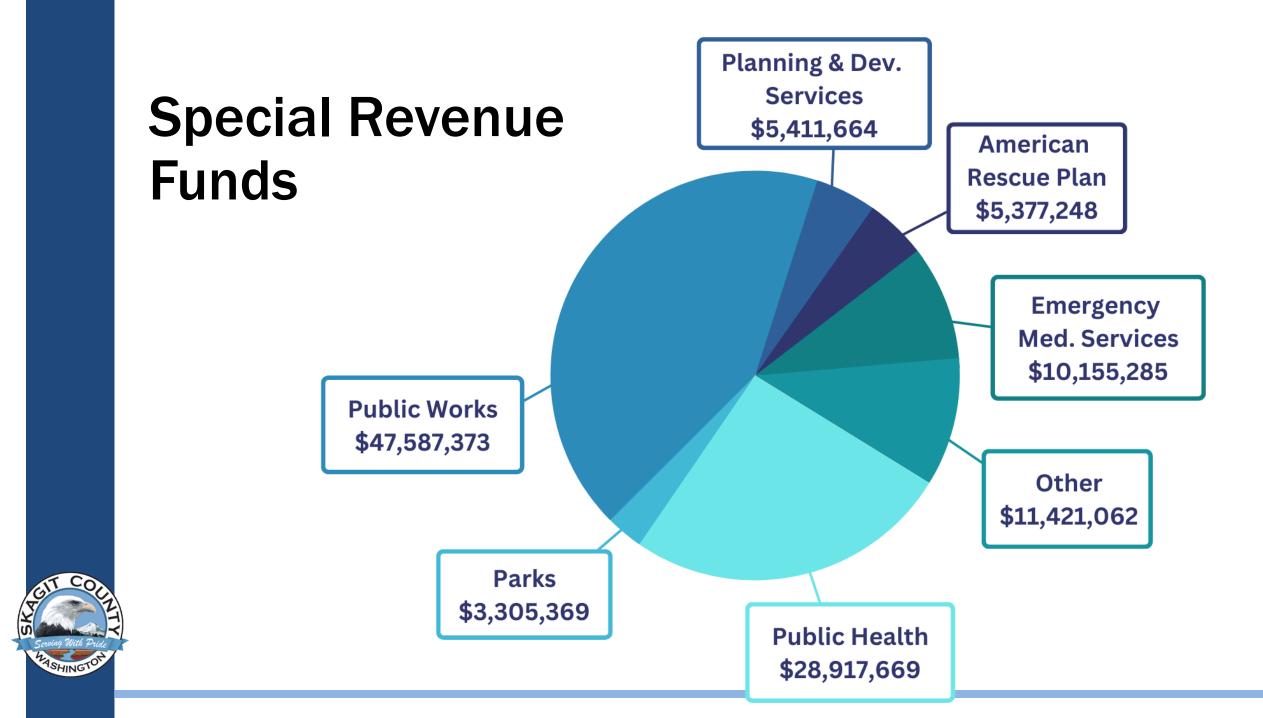
Debt Service Fund

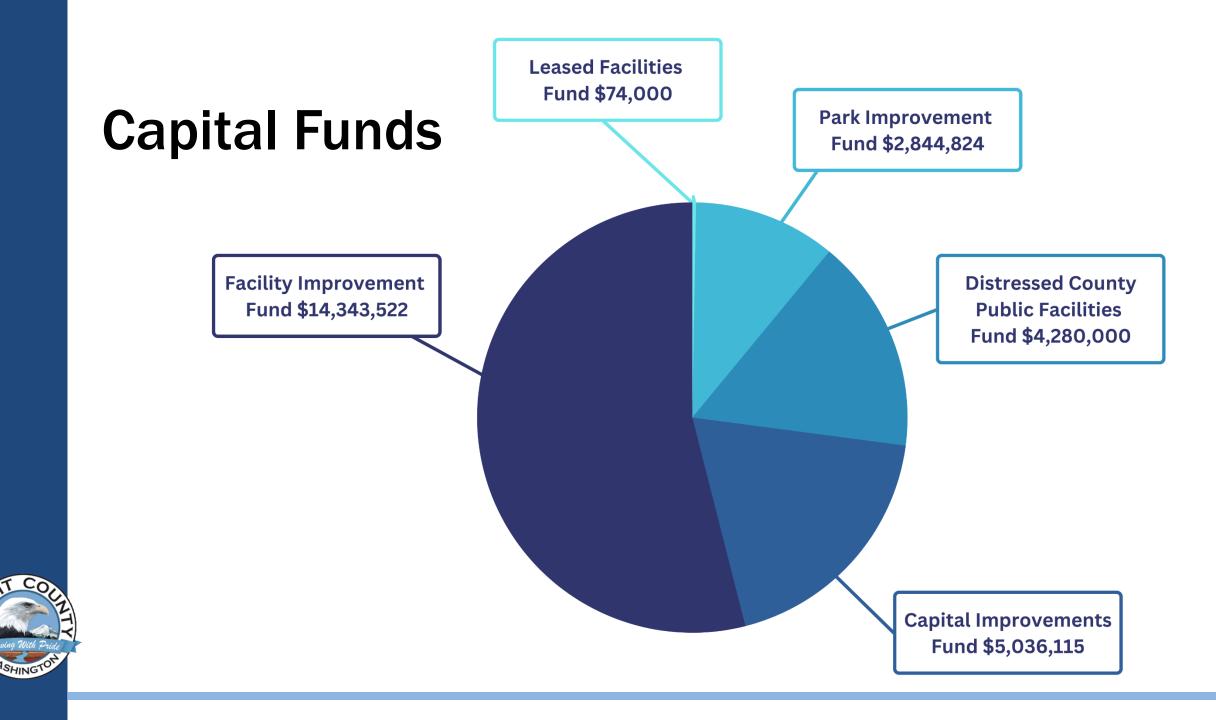
The Commissioners currently have outstanding debt obligations for the following projects:

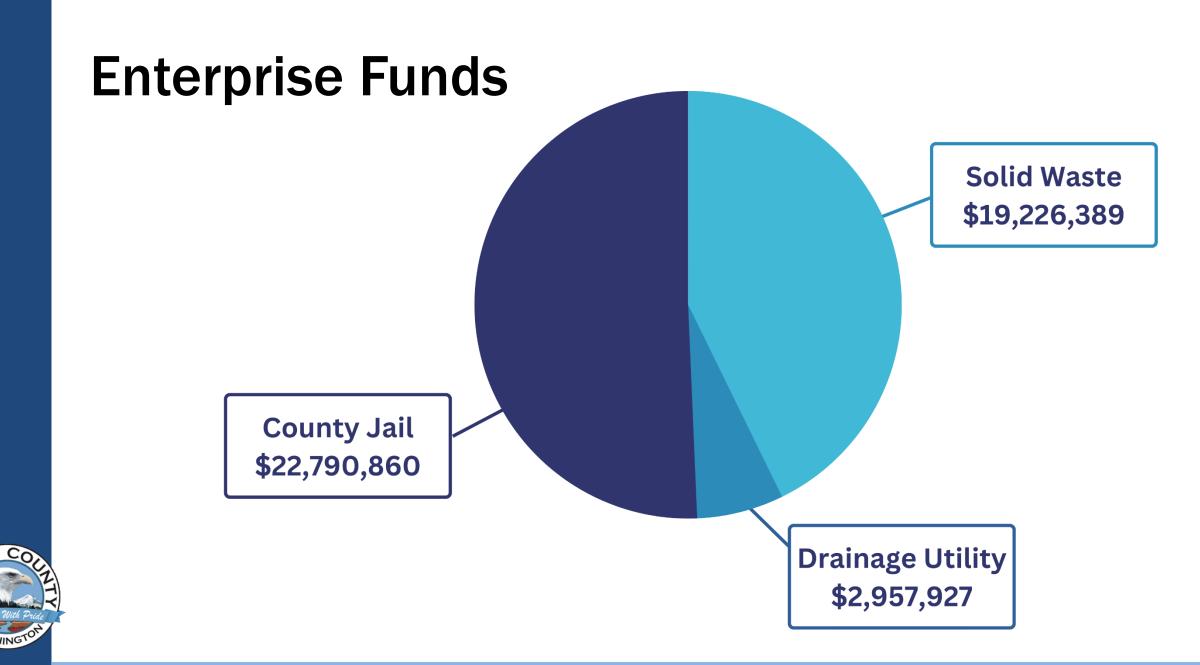
- Commissioner's Administration Building

- Water Quality Loans (Septic Systems)

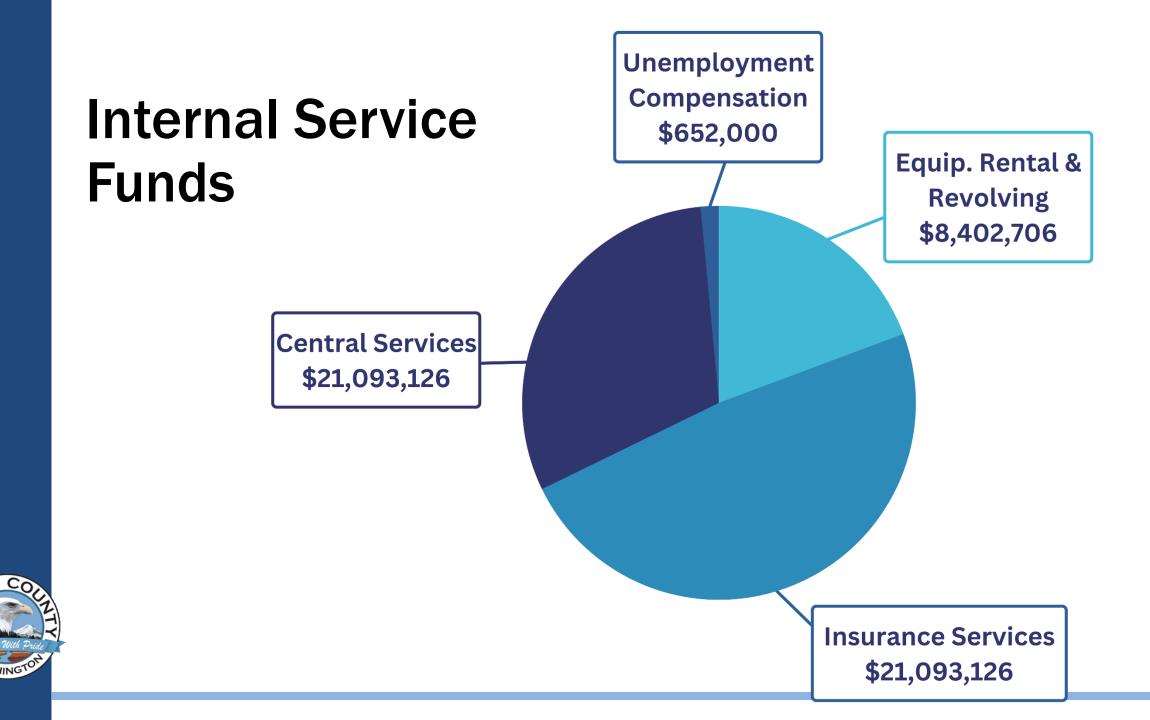


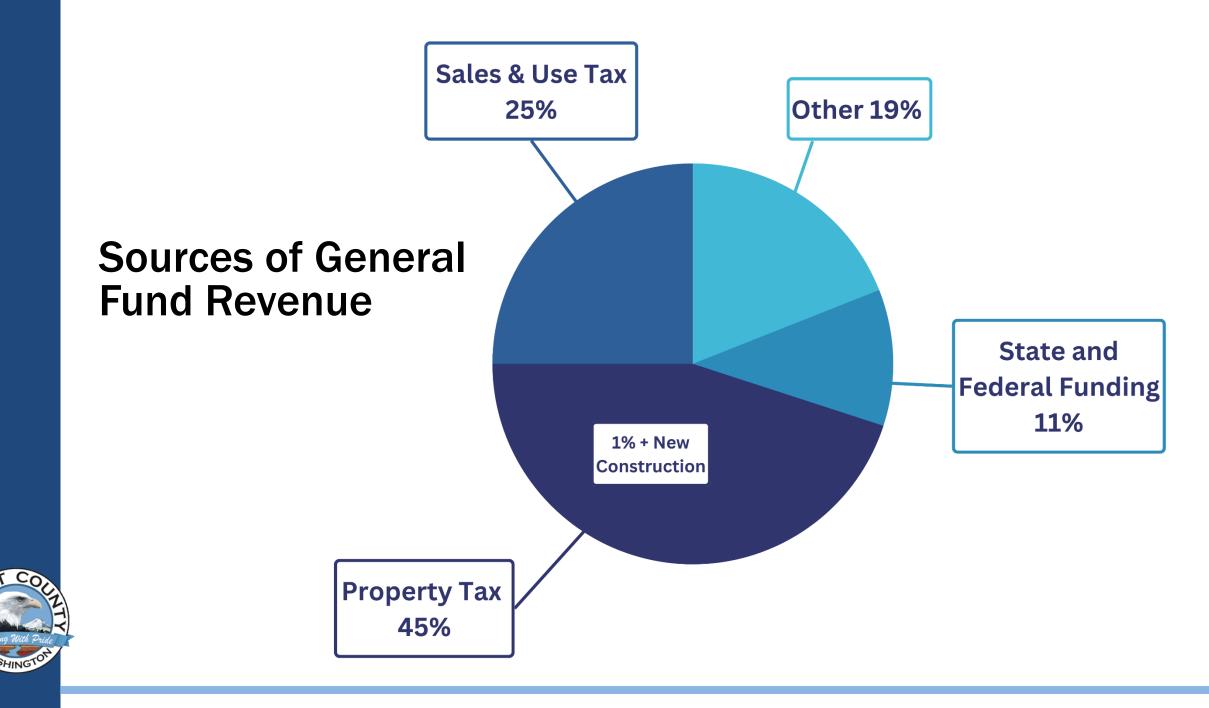
2024 Preliminary Budget Expenditure \$1,987,595

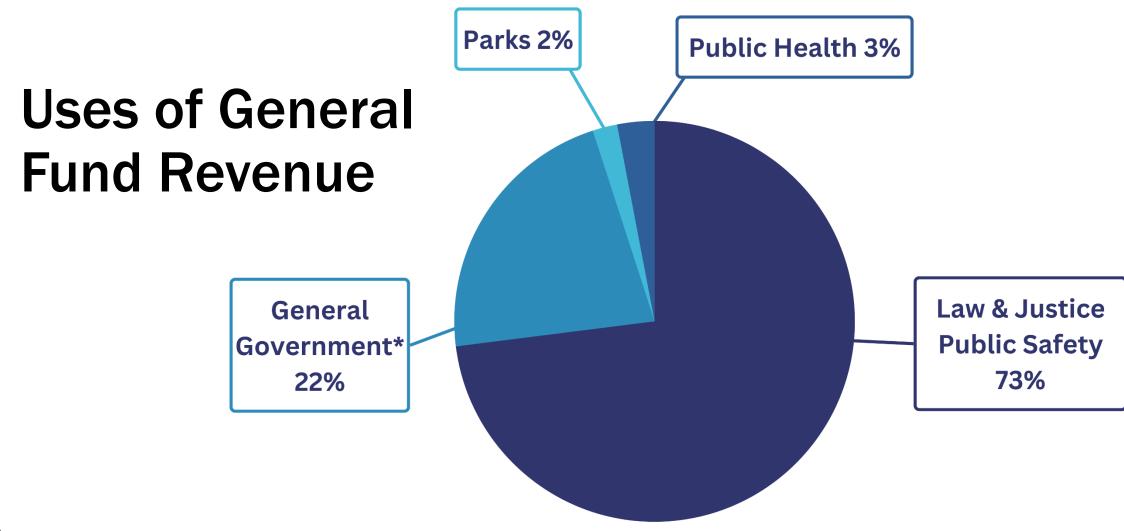

2024 Budget Staff Survey

County Commissioners distributed a survey to all staff seeking input on cost reduction strategies

Staff Recommendations

- Allow for more flexible and remote work schedules
- Reduce expenditures for supplies and equipment
- Decrease middle manager and coordinator positions
- Create new revenue by selling unnecessary vehicles and increasing fees
- Combine some departments into one location to reduce lobby staff

- Hire a purchasing and grants staff member
- Increase professional staff to reduce the need for consultants
- Reduce staff through attrition rather than layoff
- Provide updates on the overall budget process and specific department expenditures



American Rescue Fund Act (ARPA)

- Staff positions (11)
 - Prosecuting Attorney's Office, Superior Court, District Court, Probation, Public Health, Sheriffs Office, DEM
- Behavioral Health
 - Crisis Stabalization Campus Capital Project (48 new beds)
 - North Star Project
 - School based behavioral health and learning support programming
- Emergency Preparedness
 - Medical Reserve Corp
- Public Health Office and Service Center
 - Relocated to an office that provides adequate space for staff and services and more easily accessible to the public
- Broadband, Business and Workforce Support
 - Partnerships with EDASC and the Port of Skagit
- Social Determinants of Health
 - Childcare, food security



2024 Investments

Workforce

- ✓ Cost of Living wage adjustment of 2%
- ✓ Time between salary schedule steps reduced to 12 months
- ✓ Vacation accrual increase
- ✓ Sick leave maximum carry over increase
- ✓ Staff Training

Workplace Culture

- ✓ All staff 2nd annual picnic
- ✓ County Connects

County Facilities

- ✓ Two new watercraft for emergency response
- ✓ New office for elections to increase public viewing and security
- ✓ New office for Prosecuting Attorney's Office
- ✓ Spanish language access to elections

Public Infrastructure

✓ Design for 11 culverts



General Fund Budget Reductions

- Salary and Benefit Reductions (Net): \$438,502
 - Includes funding 2 Crisis Response Deputies with ARPA funding
 - Elimination of a position due to attrition
 - Leaving a vacant part time position unfilled
- Supplies/Services Reductions (Net): \$827,646
 - Includes using fund balance in Law Library, Elections
 - Includes reducing transfer to PH due to new PH revenues
 - Miscellaneous line item reductions mostly excluding travel and training
