Case referrals will be from Superior Court, Juvenile Court, and District Court. Compensation is based on a rate schedule and shall not exceed \$200,000. The Agreement is ratified to commence on January 1, 2025 and continue until December 31, 2026.
- 6. Personal Services Agreement with Carrington Law LLC to provide indigent defense representation for Guardianship cases to clients referred by Superior Court or approved by the Presiding Judge for Assigned Counsel. Cases include those under the Uniform Guardianship Act RCW 11.130.200. Compensation is based on a rate schedule and shall not exceed \$200,000. The Agreement is ratified to commence on January 1, 2025 and continue until December 26, 2026.

- 10. Resolution authorizing Commissioner Peter Browning to electronically sign the submission of Amendment No. 1 to Consolidated Contract No. C20240672 with Washington State Department of Health (DOH Contract NO. CLH32065).
- 11. Amendment No. 1 to Consolidated Contract No. C20240672 with Washington State Department of Health (DOH Contract NO. CLH32065) for the delivery of public health services in Skagit County. This Amendment adds Statements of Work to programs outlined in Exhibit A and allocates compensation to Skagit County in the amount of \$3,433,538. The term remains the same and shall continue until December 31, 2027. All other terms and conditions of the original Agreement shall remain in effect.
- 12. Amendment No. 1 to Subrecipient Agreement No. C20240403 with Catholic Community Services of Western Washington to implement a program to provide recovery services to individuals with a substance use disorder or who have history of substance use problems through a grant from Washington State Health Care Authority (HCA Contract No. K6105, Skagit County Contract No. C20220326). This Amendment modifies the compensation rate table. Compensation remains the same and shall not exceed \$146,000. The term remains the same and shall continue until June 30, 2025. All other terms and conditions of the original Agreement shall remain in effect.
- 13. Amendment No. 1 to Subrecipient Agreement No. C20240295 with Catholic Community Services of Western Washington to provide substance use disorder short-term housing subsidies for recovery support services for

people who are homeless or at risk of becoming homeless through a grant from Washington State Health Care Authority (HCA Contract No. K7237, Skagit County Contract No. C20230533). This Amendment increases compensation from \$142,500 to \$177,777.35 to provide funds for additional services. The term remains the same and shall continue until June 30, 2025. All other terms and conditions of the original Agreement shall remain in effect.

14. Personal Services Agreement with Pioneer Human Services to provide clinically managed, non-medical, subacute, withdrawal management services and flexible spending funds to the specified population in Exhibit A who do not have Medicaid or other insurance coverage at the Skagit County Crisis Center in Burlington. Compensation is based on a reimbursement fee schedule and shall not exceed \$75,262.44. The Agreement is ratified to commence on January 1, 2025 and shall continue until December 31, 2025.
