- 4. Interlocal Cooperative Agreement with Washington State University (WSU) for the provision of Education Programs provided by Cooperative Extension Services in the four areas of Agriculture and Natural Resources, Family and Consumer Sciences, Food Access, and 4-H/Youth Development. Compensation shall not exceed \$359,284. The Agreement is ratified to commence on January 1, 2024 and shall continue until December 31, 2024.
- 5. Personal Services Agreement with Maureen Pettitt to provide technical assistance, planning and facilitation for a series of workshops for the Public Defender Department. Compensation is based on an hourly rate schedule and shall not exceed \$25,000. The Agreement is ratified to commence on April 1, 2024 and shall continue until December 31, 2024.

#### c) AUDITOR:

- 6. Licensing Office Training Agreement between Anacortes and Sedro-Woolley Sub-agencies. Sedro-Woolley Licensing will provide training services for up to three new staff members of Anacortes Licensing. Compensation from Anacortes Licensing Sub-agency to Sedro-Woolley Licensing Sub-agency shall be \$2.00 per hour for each staff member undergoing training. Training commenced on April 1, 2024 and shall continue for 90 days.
- 7. Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with North Sound Accountable Community of Health (ACH) for collaboration with external agencies for the translation of voting materials. North Sound ACH will reimburse the Auditor's Office/Elections Department for expenses incurred. Compensation shall not exceed \$75,000. The MOU is ratified to commence on February 1, 2024 and shall continue until December 31, 2025.

#### d) FACILITIES MANAGEMENT:

8. Vendor Services Agreement with Millig, LLC to program HVAC controls towards improving energy performance at the Community Justice Center located at 201 Suzanne Lane in Mount Vernon which does not currently comply with the State Clean Buildings Program. Compensation shall not exceed \$175,474. The Agreement shall commence on the date of execution and continue for 8 months.

# g) PARKS, RECREATION AND FAIR:

Vendor Services Agreement with United Site Services of Nevada, Inc. to provide rental, delivery, pumping, cleaning and removal of portable chemical toilets including accessible, standard, event, and deluxe units for designated locations in and around Skagit County Parks and the Skagit County Fairgrounds. Compensation shall not exceed \$39,000. The Agreement shall commence on the date of execution and continue for one year.

## h) PUBLIC HEALTH:

- 13. Facility Use Agreement with McIntyre Hall Performing Arts and Conference Center and Skagit Valley College for use of the facility for the Skagit County Recovery Provider Summit Event on May 23, 2024. Compensation shall not exceed \$5,000. The Agreement is ratified to commence on March 21, 2024 and shall continue until June 30, 2024.
- 14. Amendment No. 1 to Interlocal Agreement No. C20230467 with Washington State Department of Children, Youth, and Families (DCYF) DCYF Agreement No. 24-1173 to provide high quality home visiting services to vulnerable families for the purpose of improving outcomes for participants and strengthening coordination of services. This Amendment updates the statement of work to remove section 12.h.(4) and add section 15 and increases compensation from \$438,494.60 to \$475,355.41. This Amendment is ratified to commence on January 1, 2024 and shall continue until July 31, 2024. All other terms and conditions of the original Agreement shall remain in effect.
- 15. Amendment No. 1 to Personal Services Agreement No. C20230227 with United General District 304 to continue capacity building to create a comprehensive, coordinated system of early learning supports and resources for families with young children. This Amendment updates the Scope of Work to include partnering with local birth centers to increase access and identifies and establishes partnerships for healthy fatherhood supports. Compensation is increased from \$47,000 to an amount not to exceed \$75,000. The term remains the same and shall continue until May 31, 2024. All other terms and conditions of the original Agreement shall remain in effect.

#### i) PUBLIC WORKS:

- 16. Amendment No. 2 to Vendor Services Agreement No. C20210204 with Orkin Pest Control to provide pest control services at the Skagit County Recycling and Transfer Station, located at 14104 Ovenell Road in Mount Vernon, and The Guemes Ferry Terminal located at 500 I Street in Anacortes. This Amendment extends the term of the Agreement from May 7, 2024 to May 7, 2025 and includes an additional charge of \$20.00 for each replacement bait station plus tax. Total compensation remains the same and shall not exceed \$15,000. All other terms and conditions of the original Agreement and prior Amendment shall remain in effect.
- 17. Amendment No. 5 to Grant Agreement No. C20230364 with the Washington State Conservation Commission (2023-25 Biennium Contract No. K2425) to continue implementation of the Voluntary Stewardship Program (VSP) plan work. This Amendment increases compensation by \$50,625 for a new total compensation amount not to exceed \$729,912.15 for additional VSP projects known as Blanken and Sybrandy. The term remains the same and shall continue until June 30, 2025. All other terms and conditions of the original Agreement and prior Amendments shall remain in effect.

# j) SHERIFF:

- 18. Amendment No. 1 to Interlocal Agreement No. C20210679 with the Town of La Conner for law enforcement services. This Amendment increases compensation for the calendar year 2024 to \$348,704 and will be paid quarterly to the County. The term remains the same and shall continue until December 31, 2026. All other terms and conditions of the original Agreement shall remain in effect.
- 19. Agreement with Public Safety Testing, Inc. to conduct a promotional testing selection process for the position of Patrol Lieutenant. Compensation shall not exceed \$10,100 plus travel and related expenses. The Agreement is ratified to commence on March 27, 2024 and continue until December 31, 2024.
- 20. Agreement with Public Safety Testing, Inc. to conduct a promotional testing selection process for the position of Corrections Sergeant. Compensation shall not exceed \$8,100 plus travel and related expenses. The Agreement is ratified to commence on February 12, 2024 and continue until December 31, 2024.
