Amendment No. 2 to the Rural Arterial Program Agreement, Skagit County Contract No. C20190201, with the County Road Administration Board (CRAB), Project No. 2919-01, for the Francis Road Reconstruction, Section 3 Project, Road No. 79000. This Amendment updates the language in section 16 of the Project Agreement and increases funding to Skagit County from \$1,487,221 to an amount not to exceed \$2,400,000. All other terms and conditions of the original Agreement and prior Amendment shall remain in effect.
- 15. Amendment No. 1 to Solid Waste Management Local Solid Waste Financial Assistance Agreement No. SWMLSWFA-2021-SkCoPW-00013, Skagit County Contract No. C20210580, with the State of Washington Department of Ecology (DOE) to provide funding for Moderate Risk Waste Collection, Disposal and Outreach and Waste Reduction/Recycling-Public Education and Outreach. This Amendment increases funding from \$512,665.33 to a total amount not to exceed \$562,172.89. DOE shall provide 75% (\$421,629.67) in grant funding to Skagit County and Skagit County shall contribute 25% (\$140,543.22). The term remains the same and shall continue until June 30, 2023. All other terms and conditions of the original Agreement shall remain in effect.
- 16. Amendment No. 2 to Contract No. C20200574 with the Washington State Department of Ecology (Toxics Cleanup Remedial Action Grant Program Agreement No. TCPRA-1921-SkCoPW-00017) to cover the implementation of remediation activities and applicable post-closure work at March Point (Whitmarsh) Landfill. This Amendment transfers \$522,218.89 from Cleanup Construction to Engineering Design, and extends the term of the Agreement from June 30, 2023 to June 30, 2025.
