**1. CONSENT AGENDA FOR MONDAY, JUNE 22, 2026 (items 1 through 11):**

a) COMMISSIONERS:

b) FACILITIES MANAGEMENT:

4. Amendment No. 1 to Vendor Services Agreement No. C20260133 with Daikin Comfort Technologies Distribution Inc. dba Air Reps, LLC to repair the designated HVAC compressor and components at the Skagit County Administration Building located at 700 South 2nd Street in Mount Vernon. This Amendment updates the Scope of Work and increases compensation by \$13,290 plus tax. Total compensation shall not exceed \$48,290 plus tax. The term remains the same and shall continue until December 31, 2026. All other terms and conditions of the original Agreement shall remain in effect.

c) INFORMATION SERVICES:

5. Agreement with Pictometry International Corp. dba Eagle View for the purchase of Pictometry Connect license(s) which provide up to 50 concurrent authorized users the ability to login and access the Pictometry-hosted custom imagery libraries. Compensation shall not exceed \$2,200 plus tax. The Agreement is ratified to commence on February 27, 2026 and continue until February 26, 2027.

d) PUBLIC HEALTH:

6. Interlocal Cooperative Agreement with the Town of Concrete to facilitate a Community Services Program at the Concrete Community Center. Compensation to Skagit County shall not exceed \$2,341.50. The Agreement shall commence on July 1, 2026, and continue until December 31, 2026.
7. Interlocal Cooperative Agreement with Eastern Washington University to maintain the Skagit Trends data indicator web-based dashboard, a project of the Population Health Trust, and other responsibilities per paragraph two of the Agreement. Compensation shall not exceed \$9,000. The Agreement shall commence on July 1, 2026 and continue through December 31, 2026.

e) PUBLIC WORKS:

8. Washington State Military Department Public Assistance Grant Agreement Number D26-106 with the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) to receive funds for emergency work, repair, and/or replacement of facilities damaged by the December 2025 Winter Weather Event as approved by FEMA. The Agreement is ratified to commence on December 5, 2025 and shall continue until April 7, 2030. Compensation will be determined following approval of project worksheets.
9. Vendor Services Agreement with Triangle Pump and Equipment, Inc. to repair the North Similk pump which was damaged during the December 2025 flood event. Compensation shall not exceed \$50,000. The Agreement is ratified to commence on May 1, 2026 and shall continue for one year.
10. Amendment No. 2 to Vendor Services Agreement No. C20230238 with Industrial Mowing and Spraying to provide mowing and/or brush cutting services within County owned Right-of-Ways. This Amendment increases compensation by \$1,000 for services that were performed prior to the expiration of the Agreement. Total compensation shall not exceed \$31,000. All other terms and conditions of the original Agreement and prior Amendment shall remain in effect.

f) SUPERIOR COURT:

11. Amendment No. 1 to Interagency Agreement No. C20250473 with the Washington State Administrative Office of the Courts (AOC2808) to provide reimbursement for court interpreter and language access service expenses. This Amendment reduces compensation to reallocate funds that are anticipated to remain unused. Compensation to Skagit County is reduced from \$97,601 to an amount not to exceed \$79,959. The term remains the same and shall continue until June 30, 2026. All other terms and conditions of the original Agreement shall remain in effect.

**2. MISCELLANEOUS AGENDA (1 item):**

a) PUBLIC WORKS:

1. Amendment No. 1 to Conversion Reimbursement Agreement No. C20260060 with Wylie, Inc., to reimburse the County for costs and expenses incurred related to the Farmland Legacy Program (FLP) Conservation Easement conversion request made by Wylie, Inc. The request involves a boundary line adjustment and a potential transfer of approximately 2.15 acres of land, identified as Assessor's Tax Parcel No. P17011, which is currently included in the Wylie, Inc. Conservation Easement under Skagit County Agreement No. C20160211, to a third-party owner of the adjacent property, identified as Assessor's Tax Parcel No. P17009. This Amendment reflects the Boundary Line Adjustment requirement in Skagit County Code 14.76.200(4) and removes 2.15 acres without impacting the intended purpose of the Conservation Easement. All other terms of the original Agreement shall remain in effect.
