d) OFFICE OF JUVENILE COURT:

- 7. Interlocal Cooperative Agreement with La Conner School District to fund a BECCA Case Manager Position to help file truancy petitions, provide truancy intervention, and case management. Compensation to Skagit County shall not exceed \$3,160. The Agreement shall commence on September 1, 2025 and shall continue through August 31, 2026.
- 8. Interlocal Cooperative Agreement with Burlington-Edison School District to fund a BECCA Case Manager Position to help file truancy petitions, provide truancy intervention, and case management. Compensation to Skagit County shall not exceed \$18,436. The Agreement shall commence on September 1, 2025 and shall continue through August 31, 2026.

f) PUBLIC HEALTH:

- 10. Collaboration Agreement with Bright Beginnings d/b/a Lantern, a national non-profit organization that provides ongoing free informational text messages to parents and caregivers of children prenatal to age eleven. Compensation for use of the keyword and subscriber platform shall not exceed \$9,000. The Agreement is ratified to commence on June 1, 2025 and shall continue until May 31, 2026.
- 11. Interlocal Cooperative Agreement with City of Mount Vernon to set forth the duties between the City and the County regarding a law enforcement embedded social worker program that employs a social worker to provide outreach and engagement to enhance and assist in community support services to vulnerable populations. Compensation shall not exceed \$77,000. The Agreement is ratified to commence on January 1, 2025 and continue until December 31, 2025.
- 12. Memorandum of Understanding with Skagit Habitat for Humanity to assist eligible low-income Skagit County residents with down payment assistance for first-time homebuyers. The maximum assistance per household is 20% of the sale price of the home, up to \$100,000, and is contingent upon the availability of funding which will cease once the grant is fully expended. Funding is provided through Contract No. C20240493 with the Washington State Department of Commerce. The Memorandum will commence on the date of execution and continue until December 31, 2027.

g) PUBLIC WORKS:

- 13. Amendment No. 29 to Grant Agreement No. C20230364 with Washington State Conservation Commission (2023-25 Biennium Contract No. K2425) to continue implementation of the Voluntary Stewardship Program (VSP) plan work. This Amendment cancels the updates made to the budget in Amendment No. 28. Compensation remains the same and shall not exceed \$1,245,324.46. The term remains the same and shall continue until June 30, 2025. All other terms and conditions of the original Agreement and prior Amendments shall remain in effect.
- 14. Amendment No. 30 to Grant Agreement No. C20230364 with Washington State Conservation Commission (2023-25 Biennium Contract No. K2425) to continue implementation of the Voluntary Stewardship Program (VSP) plan work. This Amendment increases compensation by \$11,675 to update the budget for two existing projects for a new total compensation amount not to exceed \$1,256,999.46. The term remains the same and shall continue until June 30, 2025. All other terms and conditions of the original Agreement and prior Amendments shall remain in effect.
- 15. Amendment No. 31 to Grant Agreement No. C20230364 with Washington State Conservation Commission (2023-25 Biennium Contract No. K2425) to continue implementation of the Voluntary Stewardship Program (VSP) plan work. This Amendment decreases compensation by \$10,626.28 to update the budget for three existing projects for a new total compensation amount not to exceed \$1,246,373.18. The term remains the same and shall continue until June 30, 2025. All other terms and conditions of the original Agreement and prior Amendments shall remain in effect.
