- 5. County Facility Use Agreement with Celtic Arts Foundation to use County-owned parking lots for visitors of the Foundation's Highland Games. There is no compensation associated with this Agreement. The Agreement shall commence on July 8, 2023 and continue until July 9, 2023.
- 6. Vendor Services Agreement with Evergreen Moving Systems, Inc. to provide moving services at multiple Skagit County facilities. Personal Services Agreement with Youthnet to perform intake to determine goals and develop individualized independent living skills plans for youth referred by Skagit County Office of Juvenile Court. Compensation is based on a rate schedule and shall not exceed \$12,000. The Agreement is ratified to commence on July 1, 2023 and continue until June 30, 2025.

# d) PUBLIC HEALTH:
