b) ASSIGNED COUNSEL:

- 6. Personal Services Agreement with Snohomish County Public Defender Association to provide consultation and representation for cases considered to be conflict of interest cases for the Skagit County Public Defender's Office and that have been determined to be within the scope of indigent defense. Case referrals will be from Superior Court, Juvenile Court, and District Court. Cases include Class A (including homicides), Class B, and Class C felonies for adults and juveniles. Compensation shall not exceed \$381,600 for 120 cases per year and is based on a rate schedule. The Agreement shall commence on January 1, 2024 and continue until December 31, 2024.
- 7. Personal Services Agreement with Sarah Hayne, Attorney at Law, to provide indigent defense representation to defendants referred by the Office of Assigned Counsel, Superior Court, Juvenile Court and District Court who have been deemed conflict of interest cases for the Skagit County Public Defender's Office. Cases include Class A, Class B, and Class C felonies, homicides, dependency type cases, misdemeanors and gross misdemeanors for adults and juveniles. Compensation shall not exceed \$150,000. The Agreement is ratified to commence on October 1, 2023 and shall continue until December 31, 2024.

c) FACILITIES MANAGEMENT:

8. Amendment No. 1 to Vendor Services Agreement No. C20220488 with Pacific Style Landscapes, Inc. to provide snow removal services at the Evaluation and Treatment Center in Sedro-Woolley. This Amendment extends the term of the Agreement by one year to continue through November 20, 2024. Compensation remains the same and shall not exceed \$10,000 including sales tax. All other terms and conditions of the original Agreement shall remain in effect.

d) INFORMATION SERVICES:

- 9. Amendment No. 2 to Agreement No. C20200398 with NPDESPro, LLC for use of their stormwater permit tracking software to allow users to track compliance with the Phase II Municipal Stormwater Permit. This Amendment grants an additional module to Skagit County (Pollution and Prevention Visits) for use by the Public Health Department and increases compensation by \$2,000 for an initial configuration fee and also increases annual compensation from \$17,150 to \$21,650 per year plus tax. The term shall continue until canceled. All other terms and conditions of the original Agreement and prior Amendment shall remain in effect.
- 10. Vendor Services Agreement with RFI Enterprises, Inc. for door and gate access control additions for a new, secure elections area. Compensation shall not exceed \$49,900. The Agreement shall commence on the date of execution and continue for one year.

11. Amendment No. 1 to Interlocal Cooperative Agreement No. C20180385 with Skagit Valley College (SVC) to enter into further phased development efforts for the Skagit Playfields soccer facilities. This Amendment reestablishes the Agreement and updates the project costs incurred by the parties. Each party shall be responsible for its own portion of Project costs. This Amendment is ratified to commence on December 31, 2021 and shall continue until December 31, 2026. All other terms and conditions of the original Agreement shall remain in effect.

In addition, 9% of the total cost will be added for overhead costs for accounting, billing, and administrative services. The Agreement shall commence on the date of execution and continue until December 31, 2023.
- 16. Local Agency A&E Professional Services Negotiated Hourly Rate Consultant Agreement with KPFF Consulting Engineers for Professional Engineering, Environmental, and Right-of-Way Services work for the design of the new Thomas Creek Bridge, Bridge No. 40113, Project No. ES40113-2. Compensation shall not exceed \$762,858. The Agreement shall commence on the date of execution and continue until December 31, 2026.
- 17. Vendor Services Agreement with Brett Engholm Trucking, Inc. to haul habitat logs for the Barrel Springs project and other restoration projects. Compensation shall not exceed \$9,000. The Agreement is ratified to commence on September 25, 2023 and shall continue until December 31, 2024.
- 18. Amendment No. 1 to Grant Agreement No. C20230364 with the Washington State Conservation Commission (2023-25 Biennium Contract No. K2425) to continue implementation of the Voluntary Stewardship Program work plan. This Amendment increases compensation to Skagit County by \$47,000 and shall not exceed the total of \$287,000. The term remains the same and shall continue until June 30, 2025. All other terms and conditions of the original Agreement shall remain in effect.
- 19. Amendment No. 4 to Personal Services Agreement No. C20210281 with Herrera Environmental Consultants to complete an alternatives analysis, preliminary, and final design for the Lorenzen Creek Stormwater Improvement Project. This Amendment extends the term of the Agreement by one year and shall continue until December 31, 2024. All other terms and conditions of the original Agreement and prior Amendments shall remain in effect.

Amendment No. 2 to Interlocal Cooperative Agreement No. C20230148 with the City of Oak Harbor to incorporate the City of Burlington into The North Cascades Regional Special Weapons and Tactics Team (NCRS) for the purpose of setting operational standards. There is no compensation associated with this Amendment. The Amendment shall commence on the date of execution and continue until April 3, 2034. All other terms and conditions of the original Agreement and prior Amendment shall remain in effect.
- 21. Amendment No. 5 to Personal Services Agreement No. C20190194 with Skagit Animals In Need to provide shelter services for horses and other livestock. Services shall include housing, vet care, farrier care, feeding, holding animals involved in criminal cases, adoption, euthanasia, and proper disposal of animals on a sevenday a week basis. This Amendment extends the term of the Agreement from December 31, 2023 to December 31, 2024. Compensation remains the same and shall not to exceed \$50,000.
