Amendment No. 2 to Interlocal Cooperative Agreement No. C20180498 with the City of Mount Vernon through its Fire Department for the provision of Basic Life Support (BLS) Ongoing Training and Evaluation Program (OTEP) training in the "Mount Vernon Fire Department Training Hub" that includes training Fire Districts 2, 3, 7, 9 and 15 a minimum of 12 times per year for 2018 through 2024.
