20. Agreement with Guardian Security Systems, Inc. for the purchase and installation of an alarm system for a building for the Skagit County Interlocal Drug Enforcement Unit (SCIDEU). Compensation for the system shall not exceed \$3,479.15 in addition to a monthly service fee of \$57 plus sales tax. The Agreement shall commence on the date of execution and will continue for 36 months. After the initial 36-month term, the Agreement shall continue thereafter for successive one (1) year periods until terminated. (Contract No. C20240497)

- h) *3:00 p.m. 4:00 p.m. Flood Awareness Week Kick-off and Proclamation Recognizing October 7 through October 11 at Flood Awareness Week

Chair Browning reconvened the proceedings at 3:01 p.m. and introduced Department of Emergency Management Chief Julie de Losada.

Chief de Losada discussed the work to safeguard Skagit County from floods and the importance of being prepared for flooding emergencies: both in taking personal responsibility as an individual and for organizations. She discussed the important partnerships and collective efforts of the Dike Districts, dam operators, Army Corps of Engineers, Cities, Towns, emergency management teams, first responders, and public works to protect homes, businesses, and the landscape.

Discussion was held about preparedness, work to secure flood storage behind the dam, individual responsibility, community resiliency, and events occurring during Flood Awareness Week.

Commissioner Wesen read the proclamation recognizing October 7 through 11 as Flood Awareness Week.

Director of Operations at Skagit County Dike District 17 Daryl Hamburg discussed the important partnership with the Army Corps of Engineers through the PL8499 Program (Public Law 8499). This program brought together Puget Sound Energy, WA Department of Ecology, WA Department of Fish and Wildlife, Seattle City Light, and more to allow Skagit County to work to keep people dry.

Discussion was held about the Dike District certifications on the Skagit River. Their levies were classified as PL8499 levies and were supported by the Army Corps of Engineers. The PL8499 engaged the Army Corps of Engineers for flood fights and maintenance. The estimated value of the levies was over 2 billion dollars, and they were expensive to repair. Through the PL8499 Program, 80% of the cost for repairs was covered.

Discussion was held about the Samish River. It was not part of the PL8499 Program as there were many requirements and standards to meet and they had not applied.

No executive sessions were scheduled for the week of October 7, 2024.
