This goal was implemented in Skagit County planning documents, including Skagit County Code Chapter 14.62 (Concurrency) and the update to the Capital Facilities. Mr. Eckroth stated that cities and towns had their own CFP.

Mr. Eckroth also provided information about work sessions that had taken place, the Planning Commission's public hearing, deliberations on November 18, 2025, and their recommended motion to approve the CFP. He also summarized the proposed amendments to the CFP.

A discussion ensued about whether school districts had their own CFP, and that the facilities needed to be incorporated in the County's Capital Facilities Plan.

1. <u>Presentation/Possible Action: Resolution to Adopt the 2025-2030 Skagit County 5-Year Homeless Housing</u>
Plan

Housing Resource Coordinators Madeleine Anthony and Megan Starr provided a PowerPoint presentation and background information about Skagit County's 5-Year Homeless Housing Plan for 2025-2030 (Plan). Ms. Starr noted that the draft Plan had been released for public comment in October and that a public hearing had been held. It was noted that every year, Public Health convened a 5-year Homelessness Housing Task force to help develop the Plan. The task force consisted of individuals with lived experience of homelessness and service providers. The Plan incorporated feedback from surveys, community feedback, and service provider feedback. The purpose of the Plan was to provide a blueprint for implementation of the Plan, support the development of homeless housing capital developments, ensure compliance with the Growth Management Act and local comprehensive plans, and was a requirement of the Revised Code of Washington 43.135C.050.

Ms. Anthony and Ms. Starr requested that the Commissioners take action to approve Plan which would be submitted to the Department of Commerce on or before December 31, 2025.

Discussion ensued about the need for drop-in low barrier shelters in Skagit County, progress reports, goals achieved from the last Plan, winter shelters, and alternative housing solutions.

A motion was made by Commissioner Browning to approve the Resolution to adopt the 2025-2030 Skagit County 5-Year Homeless Housing Plan. (**Resolution No. R20250301**) Commissioner Wesen seconded the motion. The vote passed unanimously.
