Plan Maintenance

Evaluating and Updating the Plan

The **Skagit County Natural Hazards Mitigation Plan** will be evaluated on an annual basis to determine the effectiveness of mitigation programs, projects, or other related activities and to reflect changes in land development or programs that may affect mitigation priorities and/or strategies; the plan will be updated every five years. Five-year updates will be delivered to the Washington State Hazard Mitigation Officer for review and forwarding to the Federal Emergency Management Agency, Region X Office.

Annual Plan Evaluation

In an effort to facilitate the annual plan evaluation process, the Skagit Natural Hazards Mitigation Planning Committee will remain a semi-active group following the formal adoption of this plan and shall be charged with the responsibility of conducting an annual plan evaluation during the months of July, August, and September of each calendar year. The Director of the Skagit County Department of Emergency Management or his/her designee will be responsible for contacting the chairperson and members of the Skagit Natural Hazards Mitigation Planning Committee and organizing the annual plan evaluation process.

The Skagit Natural Hazards Mitigation Planning Committee will review the current natural hazards mitigation strategies to determine their relevance to changing situations within Skagit County as well as known changes in State or Federal policy, and to insure these mitigation strategies are addressing current and expected conditions.

As part of this annual evaluation, those communities that participate in the Community Rating System shall submit a copy of their annual evaluation report to the Chairperson of the Skagit Natural Hazards Mitigation Planning Committee no later than September 15th of each calendar year.

Following the annual plan evaluation process, the Chairperson of the Skagit Natural Hazards Mitigation Planning Committee, in cooperation with the Skagit County Department of Emergency Management, will prepare a written report describing: 1) the plan evaluation process; 2) the status of any current mitigation activities or projects; 3) any deficiencies identified as a result of the plan evaluation. Copies of this report shall be mailed to the Mayors of each of the participating municipalities, the Board of Skagit County Commissioners, the Chairperson of the Swinomish Indian Senate, the Chairperson of the Upper Skagit Tribal Council, and the Commissioners of Skagit County Dike District #12 no later than September 30th of each calendar year. In addition, a copy of this report will also be mailed to the Washington State Hazard Mitigation Officer no later than September 30th of each calendar year. **<u>NOTE</u>**: This annual plan evaluation and report is for the express purpose of evaluating and reporting the status of the various mitigation strategies and/or projects identified in this plan and to assess the progress of existing mitigation activities.

Those jurisdictions that participate in the Community Rating System are responsible for evaluating, maintaining, and updating their Community Rating System Program as well as submitting written reports in accordance with current Community Rating System requirements.

In an effort to maintain continuity and coordinate the development of mitigation strategies and the completion of mitigation activities and/or projects, Community Rating System annual evaluation reports prepared by individual jurisdictions will be reviewed, considered, and included in the annual Hazard Mitigation Plan evaluation report.

Five-Year Plan Update

Updates to the **Skagit County Natural Hazards Mitigation Plan** shall be conducted on a five-year cycle and shall commence at the direction of the Director of the Skagit County Department of Emergency Management no later than March 1st of the scheduled update year. Upon such direction, staff from the Skagit County Department of Emergency Management, in cooperation with the chairperson of the Skagit Natural Hazards Mitigation Planning Committee, will begin the process of updating the plan.

The Mayors of each of the participating municipalities, the Board of County Commissioners, the Chairperson of the Swinomish Indian Senate, the Chairperson of the Upper Skagit Tribal Council, and the Commissioners of Skagit Count Dike District #12 shall approve the updated plan and a copy of the updated plan shall be submitted to the Washington State Hazard Mitigation Officer no later than September 30th of the update year.
