



Anyone involved in emergency response typically needs IS-100, 200, and 700.

IS-800 is needed for G-0300 and G-0400. IS-2200 is needed for G-0191 and G-2300.

These courses are available self-paced online or in-person in these 1-day combo courses.

You don't have to attend all of the sections of a combo course. Just stay for the ones that you need!

These are courses intended for on-scene incident responders that will be in leadership roles.

0300 is a 3-day, in-person course
0400 is a 2-day, in-person course

These courses are intended for individuals that will be supporting the on-scene incident response.

0402 is a half-day, in-person course
0191 is a 1-day, in-person course
2300 is a 3-day, in-person course

MGT 416: Introduction to Continuity of Government Planning for Rural Jurisdictions

MGT 416 is an 8-hour, DHS/FEMA-certified, tuition-free, planning and management-level course. This course is designed to help governmental officials and emergency responders in rural areas with the development of continuity plans that will help officials ensure essential governmental services remain functional across a spectrum of emergencies. This course will expose participants to the benefits of developing continuity of government plans for rural communities with special focus on succession planning, delegation of authority, redundant communications, and alternate facilities.

MGT 381: Business Continuity Planning

MGT 381 is an 8-hour, DHS/FEMA-certified, tuition-free, planning and management-level course. This course provides business continuity training to rural communities nationwide. In an effort to standardize terminology among private and public sector entities, it identifies commonalities between emergency management and business continuity planning (BCP). It outlines BCP within the framework of emergency management and the core capabilities of the National Preparedness Goal. Continuity is an important element of preparedness and an integral part of each core capability across the five mission areas of protection, prevention, mitigation, response, and recovery.
