- 2. Dairy animals must be under the 4-H member's regular care and management for 90 days prior to the official county exhibit activity.
- 3. Limit of 2 animals per class, total of 5 animals.
- 4. A 4-H Dairy Certificate must be provided for each animal exhibited.
- 5. Animals must be dehorned and Bangs vaccinated. It is strongly recommended that each animal be vaccinated for respiratory diseases prior to the Fair.
- 6. No bulls.
- 7. Animals must be double tied, halter plus a neck tie.
- 8. When showing, exhibitors are required to wear clean white pants and a tucked in, clean white shirt—no crop, tank or halter tops, shorts or capris. For safety reasons, exhibitors are required to wear sturdy leather boots or shoes—no sandals, flip flops, rubber boots or tennis shoes are allowed.
- 9. Posters are REQUIRED for each exhibitor. Posters must be about a dairy related or agricultural subject.
- 10. A supervising parent, 4-H leader or responsible adult over 18 years of age must be present every day of the fair to supervise the exhibitor.
- 11. Each exhibitor is required to participate in either the Dairy Foods or the Dairy Demonstrations Division (Division I or Division J).

- 10. Charts and graphs are not dimensional.
