## 4-H DOGS

## Superintendents: Joan Crane and Amie Adams, 360-420-0582

- 1. For additional information, please read the Guidelines for 4-H Animal Exhibitors.
- 2. Exhibitors must be enrolled in the 4-H Dog Project by the first of January and dog(s) must be under the 4-H member's regular care and management for 60 days prior to the official county exhibit activity.
- 3. Exhibitors must complete the Skagit County 4-H Dog Superintendent Entry Form to be submitted to the Superintendent via your club leader no later than the third Monday in June.
- Exhibitors participating in the county Agility Trial must submit the "4-H Dog Agility Release Form" signed by the exhibitor and parents/guardian. Dogs must be 12 months or older to participate in Agility.
- 5. All dogs and assistance dogs must pass a vet check to exhibit at the fair. Proof of Rabies vaccination by a licensed veterinarian is required for vet check. NO EXCEPTIONS.
- This show will be conducted in accordance with the "Washington State 4-H Dog Program Policies". For additional guidelines, details on entering, and state fair qualifications, refer to the Skagit County 4-H Dog & Assistance Dog Handbook. Contact your club leader for a copy of the handbook.
- 7. The State 4-H dress code will be enforced at all county contests.
- 8. Exhibitors are solely responsible and liable for the conduct of their dogs. Any dog that exhibits aggressive, and/or unsocial, and/or problem behavior that cannot be controlled by their handler may be dismissed and not allowed to return to fair.
- 9. Exhibitors are responsible for making sure their dogs are attended at all times by a responsible person (club member/leader). At least one responsible person must be seated in the benching area at all times for every 1 3 dogs. Parents are not permitted in the benching area unless otherwise directed by the Superintendent, except for times when all members must be away from the bench, such as during the county photo and/or awards ceremonies. It is required that a parent or responsible adult be seated at the end of each club benching area at all times for every 1 10 dogs.
- 10. State 4-H Fair approved benching equipment is required for every dog on the bench, consisting of a benching chain short enough to prevent the dog from falling off the bench with a bolt snap at each end, and a harness, buckle collar, or other non-choking collar. No rope ties, training or martingale collars are allowed. In addition, prong, spike collars, head collars, electric collars, and muzzles are not allowed on show grounds, with the exception of first year 4-H members who may use a head collar in obedience with Superintendent approval but will be ineligible to compete at State Fair.
- 11. Dogs may be watered on the bench, but water must be promptly removed. Under no circumstances may dogs be fed in the benching area.
- 12. Dogs must be groomed when brought onto the fairgrounds. No major grooming will be permitted, i.e., clipping coat, nail cutting, etc. In addition, it is expected that exhibitors will clean up after their dog.
- 13. Dogs are brought to the fair each day on their designated day(s) for showing. All dogs must be kept on leash while at the Fair, except when permitted in the show ring. Dogs are only allowed in the dog barn, ring area, or potty pen except when entering and leaving the grounds.
- 14. Each dog entered will remain on the bench except when in the ring or going to the approved potty area until excused by the Superintendent each evening, except for Cloverbud members who may be dismissed at the Club Leader and/or Superintendent's discretion.
- 15. Cloverbud exhibitors may show their dog at the fair on their designated day(s). They must follow all 4-H exhibitor and herdsmanship rules. They will not be scored but will receive special ribbons in all events in which they participate. They are not eligible for premiums.

- 16. Exhibitors enrolled in both Obedience and Assistance Dog projects may enter a maximum of one dog per project with approval from the Superintendent. Exhibitors may enter a second dog for Brace Obedience with approval from the Superintendent. If approved, the second dog may be benched on the designated day of competition. Intermediate and Senior exhibitors with more than one Obedience project dog may enter a maximum of two dogs with a strong recommendation from their leader and approval from the Superintendent. Two dogs may be entered in the same or different classes. ALL APPROVALS MUST BE OBTAINED PRIOR TO FAIR ENTRY DEADLINES.
  17. Educational protects are due on the leat Evidence in the same of the sector.
- 17. Educational posters are due on the last Friday in July at Doggy Come Play in Burlington.

#### **SHOWMANSHIP**

Division A - CLOVERBUD: For members between the ages of 5-7 years on October 1st of current 4-H year.

Division B - NOVICE: For members in their first year or exhibiting at the fair for the first time in Showmanship.

# Division C - OPEN: For members in their second year or above who have not received an Award of Merit at the State Fair on county day in Showmanship.

**Division D - SPECIALS:** Any Junior, Intermediate, or Senior who has received an Award of Merit at State Fair on county day must compete in the Specials Showmanship class at county fair the following year. This rule also applies to members who compete with more than one dog and have met the criteria with <u>any</u> dog. Once an exhibitor advances to the Specials class, they must compete in the Specials class for the remainder of their 4-H career.

## **REGULAR OBEDIENCE CLASSES**

Each handler and dog team must be entered in one Regular Obedience class. Classes are divided by skill level and age of the exhibitor. At all levels, a handler and dog team MUST advance to another class if a blue ribbon is earned in their current class at State Fair. \**Note: A handler and dog team may advance to a higher class without getting a blue at State. However, once a team advances, they cannot move back to a class at a lower level.* 

**INTRO** - Introductory level for Cloverbud or first year member and dog teams.

#### **Division E: INTRODUCTORY OBEDIENCE**

Note: In Introductory Obedience, with the exception of Cloverbuds, handler and dog teams may only compete in this class for one year and must advance to one of the Tier 1 classes the following year. This is a non-qualifying class and is not offered at the State Fair.

- 1. Scorecard C0679 will be used to judge all educational displays. Refer to the scorecard when planning the display.
- 2. No copyrighted illustrations or cartoons may be used unless permission has been granted. The display must credit any source of copyrighted information used by permission.
- 3. All work must have been created during the current 4-H year.
- 4. All educational displays must be labeled on the back with the following information:
  - a. Name, First and Last
  - b. County
  - c. Club
  - d. Age Division (Cloverbud, Junior, Intermediate, Senior)
  - e. Department (i.e., Dogs)

(If the display is 3D, attach a card with identifying information.)

- 5. Exhibits will be displayed according to the identified 4-H project area in the appropriate barn/building, as space permits.
- 6. Educational posters/displays will be accepted no later than the last Friday in July at Doggy Come Play.
- 7. For displays identified with an animal project area, check individual animal project divisions for specific criteria, if any.
- 8. Entries must be the work of the individual exhibitor.
- 9. Poster surfaces should be flat; no dimensional attachments, no foam core board. The minimum poster size is 14" x 22"; maximum size is 22" x 28".

10. Charts and graphs are not dimensional.
