- 2. Goats must be under the 4-H member's regular care and management for 60 days prior to the official county exhibit activity.
- 3. Entries are due by the second Friday in July, all other entries are at the fair's discretion.
- 4. Exhibitors are limited to ten goats and two entries per class.
- 5. **All animals** must be tattooed, ear-tagged or micro chipped.
- 6. No bucks allowed.
- 7. No horned dairy or pygmy goats allowed. 4-H meat goats may have horns as long as exhibited goats have horn protectors per WSU EM0758E.
- 8. Cloverbuds may enter one Pygmy or miniature dairy goat of any age.
- 9. All goats must adhere to Federal Scrapie program requirements.
- 10. Barn decorations are required and must feature a club name.
- 11. Posters are required of all 4-H members and must be turned in by 9 am Thursday to the superintendent.
- 12. Pens must be clean by 9 am each day. Exhibitors are required to supply their own feed and make sure their animals are cared for.
- 13. The Superintendent will determine the order of the show.
- 14. Set up will be the day of haul in. Exhibitors must have stall cards and decorations up by 9 am Thursday morning.
- 15. When filling out entries, please fill out COMPLETELY including the name of the animal, tag/number, tattoo and date of birth.
- 16. Outstanding exhibitor applications are due by 5:00 pm on Friday of the fair. Contact the superintendent for an application.
