## **DIVISION A: 4-H FASHION REVUE**

- 1. Open to members enrolled in a clothing project.
- 2. This division is considered to be the "Showmanship" division for clothing project members. Only one entry per exhibitor allowed.
- 3. This contest takes place on Saturday of Fair week.
- 4. Members will model their garment(s) in an interview with a judge, and also during the 4-H Fashion Show on stage.
- 5. At least one garment must be handmade.
- 6. Entrants must submit the following on entry day: Personal datasheet WSU publication EM0682, available at Extension Office or online at <u>www.4h.wsu.edu</u>, completely filled out by 4-Her, with photo of member in outfit, and commentary neatly typed on a separate sheet of paper.
- 7. Members must sign up for an interview time in the 4-H Building.
- 8. Accessories may be made or purchased by 4-Her.
- 9. 4-Hers will be judged for construction as it affects garment appearance, overall appearance, modeling skills, poise, knowledge of subject matter, and the worksheet.
- 10. Additional guidelines are available at the Extension Office.
- 11. Primaries may not compete in this contest.
- 12. Highest scoring individuals may compete in this activity at the State Fair.

  - b. Sales receipt for purchases.
- 6. Members must sign up for an interview time.
- 7. 4-Hers will be judged on knowledge of clothing care, consumer skills, worksheet, poise, and modeling skills.

- 9. Cloverbud members may not enter this division.

- 3. Each item must have a permanently attached care label or a 3 x 5 card with care instructions, age of exhibitor and number of years in the project.
- 4. If a commercial pattern was used, the pattern envelope and instruction sheets only must accompany the items. Please label these with your name and club.
- 5. All garments must be clean.
