

## 4-H SHOOTING SPORTS EXHIBITS

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1. Open to members enrolled in a Shooting Sports project by May 1.
2. Members must participate in County shooting and knowledge contests held in June or July. Contact a Superintendent to register. The combined scores from shooting and knowledge comprise the "Fitting and Showing" score for premium points.
3. To receive premium points for these divisions, members must enter online and bring their completed target poster to the 4H Indoor exhibit building at the fairgrounds during 4-H Still Life turn in. See Fair schedule. Posters must have: target center rings or score sheet (shotgun events), name, club name, score, age department, target size, distance or discipline, and bow style or firearm type
4. Scoring for Archery, Rifle and Pistol will be the total score from 20 shots (200 points maximum) plus up to 100 points possible for the Knowledge/Stewardship test. Scoring for Shotgun will be 100 targets scored at trap, skeet or sporting clays, doubled, plus up to 100 points possible for the Knowledge/Stewardship test. Total possible points will be 300 for all divisions. Ribbon placings will be awarded based on the total score out of 300.
5. Archers will shoot 40 cm targets, barebow/basic compound at 10 yards, Olympic recurve at 10 yards, and freestyle (all other bows) at 20 yards. Trap will be shot at 16 yards, air rifle at 10 yards on the AR 5/5 target, air pistol at 10 yards on the B-40 target, .22 rifle at 50' on the A-17 target and .22 pistol at 50' on the B-2 target.
6. Members may compete once in each division. Accommodations may be made as necessary by the superintendents on a case by case basis. i.e. a verbal vs. written test. Requests must be made prior to the test date.
7. The knowledge test will be a written quiz covering topics such as: safety, nomenclature, range rules, etiquette, scoring, terminology, stewardship and history.

**Division E: Educational Posters**

1. Scorecard C0679 will be used to judge all educational displays. Refer to the scorecard when planning the display.
2. No copyrighted illustrations or cartoons may be used unless permission has been granted. The display must credit any source of copyrighted information used by permission.
3. All work must have been created during the current 4-H year.
4. All educational displays must be labeled on the back with the following information:  
 Name, First and Last  
 County  
 Club  
 Age Division (Cloverbud, Junior, Intermediate, Senior)  
 Department (example – Beef Cattle)  
 (If display is 3D, attach a card with identifying information.)
5. Exhibits will be displayed according to the identified 4-H project area in the appropriate barn/building, as space permits.
- 6. Educational displays will be accepted on Friday before the fair at 5:00 pm in the Archery Barn.**
7. For displays identified with an animal project area, check individual animal project divisions for specific criteria, if any.
8. Entries must be the work of the individual exhibitor.
9. Poster surfaces should be flat; no dimensional attachments, no foam core board. The Poster's minimum size is 14" x 22"; maximum size is 22" x 28."
10. Charts and graphs are not dimensional.
