COMMUNICABLE DISEASE

717 case investigations



sexually transmitted infections, rabies, foodborne illness, respiratory illness, and more

770 vaccines

435 administered to children
335 administered to adults



COMMUNITY HEALTH AND PREVENTION

564 families received newborn outreach at local hospitals



to promote healthy beginnings for babies and families, with **220** referrals made to community supports

114 families were supported by resource navigation

300 referrals were made to a wide range of resources including child care, food assistance, housing, mental health services, parenting support, and more



The Community Health Assessment was completed by the Population Health Trust. Data collection and outreach reflected Skagit County's diversity, engaging rural communities, individuals with developmental disabilities, older adults, families, and Spanish-speaking community members



COMMUNITY SERVICES

33,447 bed nights of shelter

for people experiencing homelessness at year-round shelters, winter shelters, and temporary severe weather shelters



868 received prevention and diversion services

to resolve immediate housing crises and avoid homelessness through financial assistance and connections to community resources

396 Veterans served each month on average (Sept-Dec)

benefit claims, housing assistance, basic needs, and other supportive services

3,418 doses of naloxone distributed

92 reported overdoses reversed

using county distributed naloxone (91 humans, 1 dog)



253,000 syringes exchanged

\$157K financial assistance

issued to **768** low-income individuals and households for operation and maintenance of their septic system

527 on-site sewer permit applications and plan reviews received

DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES

46 students connected to long-term support services

The Bridges Program connected students with disabilities in transition programs to long-term support services to support a successful transition from school to adulthood. Services included housing support, transportation assistance, financial aid, and more!
