## RSV



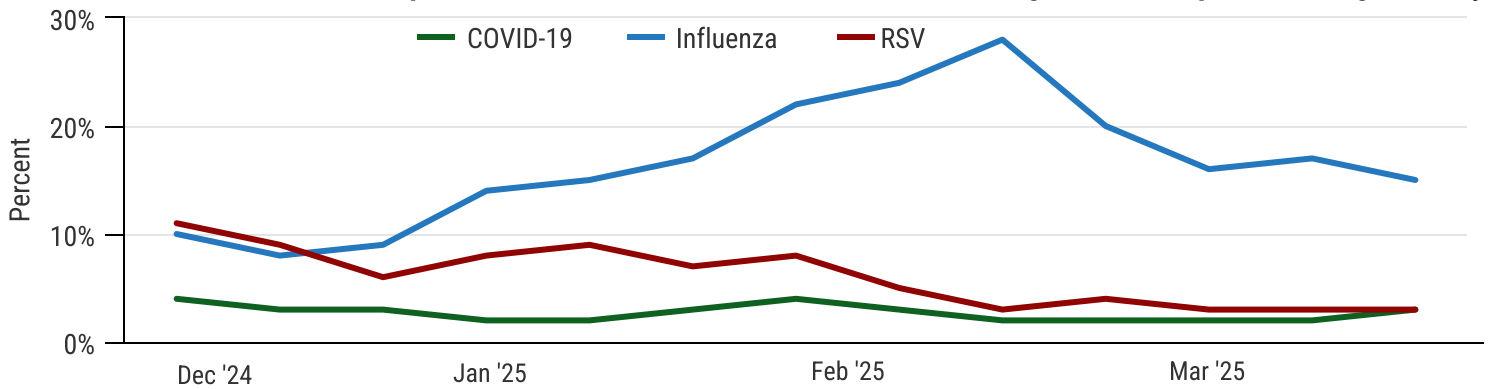
RSV activity has remained unchanged from the previous week

- 1 RSV related death in the last 3 months

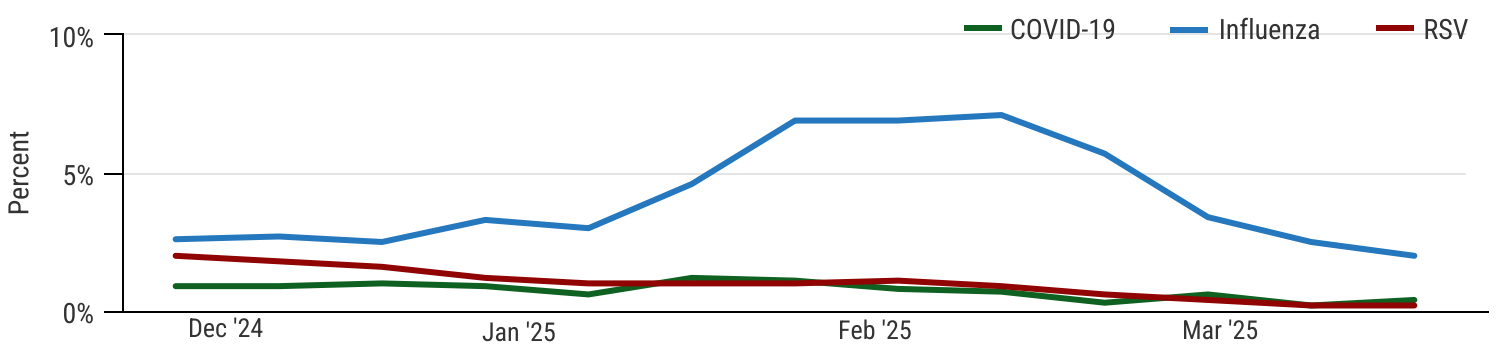
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- 0 RSV outbreaks in the last 3 months

Percent of Emergency Department (ED) visits due to COVID-19, Influenza and RSV -- Skagit County

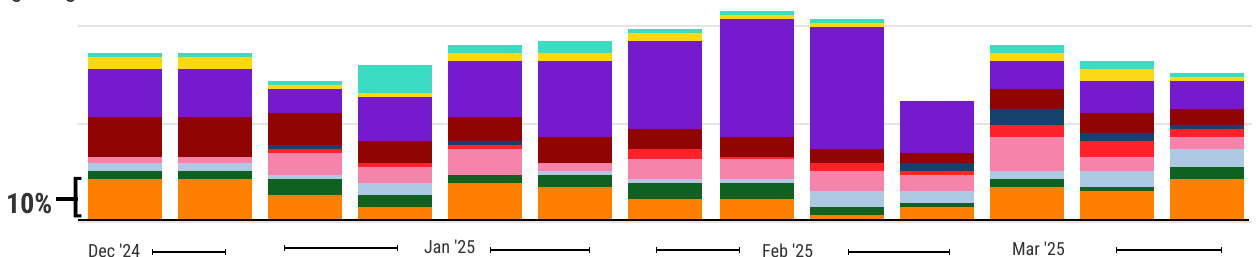


Weekly percent positivity rates of common respiratory pathogens -- Skagit County
