
SKAGIT COUNTY Septic permit process

1. HIRE AN OSS DESIGNER

On-site Sewage System (OSS) designers will work with you to determine what type of system can be installed on your parcel. We maintain <u>a list of WA State Certified OSS</u> <u>Designers that work in Skagit County</u>.



2. SUBMIT A PERMIT & PAY FEES

Permit applications, site plans, site and soil evaluations, and designs can be submitted <u>online</u> through Civic Access The required <u>fees</u> will be assessed and payment requested.



3. PUBLIC HEALTH REVIEW

Upon receipt of a complete application and payment, we'll begin review and make a determination within 30 days. If wet season/winter review is needed, the process may take up to 12 months.



4. PERMIT ISSUED

After review, possible consultation with your designer and/or site visit to your property, we'll approve the design and issue your permit. Repair permits expire after 1 year; all others expire in 3 years.

5. HIRE AN OSS INSTALLER

You'll need to hire a <u>Skagit County</u> <u>Certified OSS Installer</u> to install the system as designed. Based on the complexity of the design, not all installers will be able to complete the work.

6. OSS FINAL INSPECTION

When the installer is nearing completion, they will request a final inspection from SCPH - OSS Inspectors. We ask for 24-48 hour notice.



7. AS-BUILT & FINAL PERMIT

The final step in the permitting process is for an <u>as-built or record drawing</u> to be submitted to SCPH by your designer or installer. Once received, we'll finalize the permit which permits operation.



8. MAINTAIN YOUR SYSTEM

To ensure your system lasts for as long as possible, you'll need inspections every 1-3 years, pumping as needed, and likely minor repairs along the way.
