


# Measuring Local Homelessness


#### **Defining Homelessness**

**Literally Homeless:** Staying in an emergency shelter, in a car, in a tent, on the streets, or a place not meant for human habitation Chronically Homeless: Literally homeless more than one year OR more than three times in the last three years with the combined length of homelessness being one year or more; with a disability Fleeing Domestic Violence: Without or losing housing due to domestic violence AND lacking resources to secure housing without assistance At Imminent Risk of Homelessness: Losing housing within 14 days AND lacking the resources to secure or maintain housing

**Point in Time Count** Homeless individuals counted in 2022. More than 2900 people received homeless services in Skagit County in 2022. A Total of 6 Winter Shelters opened across Skagit in 2022 At least 253 people accessed shelter: 133 people accessed motel vouchers December 22, 2022 was the coldest day of 2022 23° / 6° F




