


16% of those experiencing an overdose were people without housing







#### PUBLIC HEALTH FOLLOW UP

No interview was attempted for 27% of individuals who experienced overdose due to exclusion criteria and delays in case identification and follow up during the COVID-19 pandemic. All data was collected through the <u>Skagit County Overdose Notifiable Condition Ordinance 12.5</u>. Counts less than ten (<10) are suppressed in order to comply with WA DOH small numbers guidance.
