


The number of reported opioid overdoses increased by 82% in 2023




1 in 6 opioid overdoses ended in death








15% of those experiencing an overdose were people without housing







### PUBLIC HEALTH FOLLOW UP

of individuals had a history of previous overdose

19% had a previous overdose in the past 12 months

had current or prior substance use disorder treatment



42% of individuals interviewed were provided with referral(s)

Based on exclusion criteria, an interview was not attempted for 30% of individuals who experienced overdose. All data was collected through the <u>Skagit County Overdose Notifiable Condition Ordinance 12.5</u>. Counts less than ten (<10) are suppressed in order to comply with WA DOH small numbers quidance.
