Agenda: The agenda was provided.

Action: It was moved and seconded to approve the agenda. Approved by a unanimous vote.

Meeting Minutes: The minutes from the January 21, 2016 meeting were provided.

Action: It was moved and seconded to approve the minutes from the meeting of January 21, 2016. Approved.

<u>Project Update</u>: Sheriff Reichardt provided an update to the project. There have been no new change orders. A few walls are up and welded into place. There will be two mock cells built to work out how the plumbing fixtures should be laid out to allow for maintenance. There will be a site tour on April 8th at 1:00 p.m. The project is on schedule.

Review of Jail Model: Susan Musselman led a discussion regarding the review of the jail model. Susan provided a few handouts. The first handout showed the 2015 FTE jail cost and 2016 FTE jail budget. In 2014, the number of projected needed FTEs for 2016 was 67.5. The second handout showed the new jail staffing plan for 2016 through 2018. The number of staff in 2016 was included in the budget. The staffing plan fully staffs the jail to work regardless of number of inmates. Population not a huge driver of how many staff is needed. The higher population means more inmates going to court so more transportation and maybe medical. Judges are a huge driver in inmate population. Judges have been involved with the discussions. The third handout was the key assumptions for the model and the updated model. We did look at the historical staffing component in connection with the County contribution. There was discussion regarding the RSA. The model is assuming no money from the State Legislature.

<u>Jail Outsourcing update</u>: Sheriff Reichardt reported that there are currently 3-4 inmates in Chelan County.

Report on Tax Collection into the Jail Fund: Jackie Brunson provided an update on the tax collection into the jail fund. Handout was provided showing the usage of jail by agency. It was requested to show numbers as well as the percentages. A handout was provided showing the Jail Fund expense report and the Jail Fund revenue report. It was requested to have the County contribution and the Cities portion separated out in the revenue fund.
